- A child is a person who has not yet reached their seventeenth birthday and is still in full time education. People who are not Society members or family members will have their fares increased by the trip-member rate (£3 per day).
- 3. The discounts highlighted above for family members refer to travel costs only. Accommodation, and permits / admission fees will be charged at cost price.
- 4. Members who wish to go on a trip must contact John Dicks prior to the book by date to confirm that they still intend to go on the trip.
- 5. Where a trip is organised with an itinerary to a specific area, it may sometimes be possible to drop off a member en route. This is known as the Trip Flyer option. Availability and exact duration of stay will be at the discretion of the Events Organiser. The fare for this option will be negotiable, depending on the drop off point and seat availability.

Bristol Parkway, Stoke Gifford, Pilning, Yate and Westerleigh

- 21/02 Additional information April Magazine; the test train top n' tailed with 67020 + 67015 was formed with dept c/stock; 6263, 5981, 72631, 977969, the return passing time for Parkway being recorded as 1213.
- 25/02 Correction April Magazine; The destination of the convoy locos from Okehampton Derby, headed by 20189 + 20142 were; 47375 to Burton, 47769 to Barrow Hill and 31459 (to remain at Derby and expected withdrawal) and not as stated.
- 08/03 Correction April Magazine; The Windhoff MPV piling train passed Parkway at 0943 (3 early) and not 93 early as stated.
- **19/03** At 1500 Stoke Gifford 'downside' held; 66528, 66544, 66555, 66956.
- 20/03 66956 + 66528 passed North Somerset junction at 0835 running 0Y31 Westbury Stoke Gifford light-engine.
- 21/03 GBRf 'rainbow' livery 66720 was reported near Abergavenny at 1340 and passing Patchway at 1451 (1 early) with the 6A84 1247 Moreton-on-Lugg Hayes (Tarmac) loaded stone. At 1210, Stoke Gifford 'downside' held; 66526, 66527, 66555, 66956.
- 22/03 56302 worked the afternoon 6V62 Tilbury (Riverside) Llanwern Exchange sidings loaded steel passing Patchway at 1851 (131 late).
- 23/03 At 1630 Stoke Gifford 'downside' held the following; 66420, 66547, 66570, 66606, 66619, 70016. Also, 66507 was shunting wagons whilst 66544 & 66554 were both stabled on separate west facing trains of coal empties.
- 24/03 66552 worked as 0Y40 light from Stoke Gifford to Westbury passing Bath at 1445, for departmental duties.
- 26/03 66848 was on the afternoon 6V62 Tilbury Riverside Llanwern exchange sidings steel service reported passing Swindon at 1452, whilst 66528 + 66617 + 66956 were an afternoon arrival at Stoke Gifford on a 0Y30 1242 light loco move from Westbury. GBRf 'rainbow' livery 66720 powered the 6A84 1247 Moreton-on-Lugg West Drayton (Tarmac) loaded stone service noted departing Parkway up loop at 1519 (6 late).
- 28/03 Standing in for the NRMT HST, 67020 + 67027 top n' tailed a 1Z20 0537 Old Oak Common Derby RTC (1538) return test train passing Parkway at 0733 (11 early), Magor 0751 (20 early), arriving Swansea at 0903 (33

- early) and departing at 1010 (-) on the return which later departed Parkway up loop at 1215 (2 late). At 1210, Stoke Gifford 'downside' held; 66515, 66526, 66555, 66606 with 66554 and 66553 coupled on separate west facing empty coal train rakes.
- 29/03 The Saturdays 0X12 Newport ADJ Westbury loco convoy was formed; $66012\,+\,66074\,+\,66148\,+\,66139.$ Later, $66092\,+\,ECR$ 66212 passed Westerleigh junction at 1420 on the 6V13 Dollands Moor Margam steel service, the latter having arrived from main land Europe for attention at Toton depot.
- **30/03** At 1230, Stoke Gifford sidings held; 66416, 66518, 66530, 66539, 66572, 66614 with 66607 & 66554 stabled on west facing empty coal trains.
- 03/04 43180 + 43097 formed a back to back HST power car move running as 0Z70 0900 Landore Old Oak Common being reported passing Patchway at 1043 (7 early) and departing Parkway at 1112 (3 late). Later, 31105 appeared on a 3Z01 Derby RTC Bristol TM (1445) test train (via Oxford) being reported passing Westerleigh junction at 1420 (9 early) and Filton Abbey Wood at 1438 (-).
- 05/04 With the line north of Yate closed as far as Standish junction, the 6B13 0505 Robeston Westerleigh (1256) loaded fuel tanks with main train loco 60020, was top n' tailed with 66076 onwards from Margam Moors, so a reverse move could take place at Yate Middle junction. The working was reported passing Parkway at 1100 (37 early) and was booked over the Tytherington branch with a reverse booked at the quarry from 1203 1208! This location was however not used having seen no rail movements in recent years, the reverse taking place on the branch near Yate from 1241 (48 late) 1256 (17 late). The 6B47 1752 return empties to Margam were reported as departing Yate at 1743 (26 early), having reversed on the down line, later passing Parkway at 1754 (24 early).
- **06/04** A diverted Sunday 6Z42 1410 Ford Halewood Southampton Eastern dock (2212) loaded car train, to be routed via the Marches, the Severn Tunnel, Filton Abbey Wood, Bath and Westbury was cancelled. The train was reported as a runner during the previous Sunday but routed via Oxford and Basingstoke.
- 07/04 Great Western power car 43041 was reported as making a solo 0Z86 1755 St.Phillips Marsh Landore (2006) move passing Severn Tunnel junction at 1804 (25 early).
- **09/04** With 56113 active on the Chirk logs, 56302 powered the 6V62 1112 Tilbury (Riverside) Llanwern Exchange sidings steel service being reported on Acton Bank at 1239 and passing Patchway at 1559 (12 late).
- 12/04 47237 + 57313 top n' tailed the return Railway Touring Company
 'The Heart of Wales', 1Z95 1941 Shrewsbury Slough (0014 Mon) rail tour
 (via the Marches and the Severn Tunnel) which featured 44871 + 45407 steam
 haulage over the Central Wales line being recorded as departing Parkway at
 2154 (16 early) with c/stock; 99122, 99128, 99127, 3093, 3136, 3058,
 99352, 99318, 4973, 99723. The outward working again via the Severn
 Tunnel, was 1Z89 0541 Slough Llandrindod (1338), which had departed
 Parkway at 0721 (3 late) with the steam locos later being attached at
 Cardiff Pengam sidings en route. The afternoon 6V62 Tilbury Llanwern
 steel service passed Patchway at 1639 (1 early) headed by 56302.
- 13/04 47813 + 47853 top n' tailed an 8 coach Chelsea v Swansea City football special as 1Z66 1028 Paddington Swansea and 1Z70 1916 return, the outward (which was routed via Barry and the Vale of Glamorgan line) passed Didcot at 1121 (-) and Parkway 1221 (5 early).
- 16/04 $\,$ 56302 powered the 6V62 1100 Tilbury (Riverside) Llanwern Exchange sidings (1611) steel service passing Swindon at 1452 (1 late) and Parkway 1537 (-).

Locos recorded on fuel tank duty at Westerleigh during the review period have included; 60017/020/024/092. 66076.

Bristol Temple Meads, Barton Hill and Kingsland Road

- 26/02 Additional Information April Magazine; the test train headed by 31285 was formed with dept c/stock; 999666, 977985, 62384, 9709.
- 19/03 66414 + 66420 top n' tailed the 4L32 1100 Bristol Railport Tilbury container service, passing Bath at 1126 and Swindon 1205. Other freight reports for the day included; 37402 + 37259 working a single FNA (550047) flask 6V74 0158 Crewe Coal sidings Bridgwater reported passing Stafford at 0244 (12 late) and the 6M63 return which departed at 1109 and passing Worle junction at 1137 and Filton Abbey Wood 1214 and Colas 56302 with the 6V54 0540 Chirk (Kronospan) Exeter (Riverside)
- New Yard (1058) empty log carriers (formed of 17 wagons) noted passing Lawrence Hill at 0936 (26 late), Worle junction 1015 (25 late), Bridgwater 1030 (33 late) and arriving Exeter at 1138 (40 late). A signalling failure in the Challow area saw some late Great Western mainline running (of up to 20 minutes) during the late afternoon.
- 20/03 Departing 60 minutes late, 56302 returned the loaded log train running as 6V51 1231 Exeter (Riverside) New yard Chirk Kronospan, passing Uphill junction at 1446 (52 late) and Patchway at 1540 (12 late).
- 22/03 Trains from Cardiff Portsmouth Harbour were reported as being disrupted terminating at Fareham or even Temple Meads due to an engineer block at Southampton. There was also a signalling problem reported in the Portsmouth area. A reduced service beyond Westbury has been in operation over the previous few Saturdays due to engineering work.
- 23/03 66617 top n' tailing 66953 working the 6Y11 0800 Standish junction Taunton Fairwater (1023) return HOBC was reported passing Weston-super-Mare station 'off route', on the loop at 1015 having passed Worle at 1005 (40 late) and later Bridgwater at 1044 (50 late). The outward working for this service during the previous evening was; 6Y11 2123 Taunton Fairwater Haresfield loop (2335).
- The new week started well at Barton Hill depot with the derailment of Voyager 221129 departing as empty stock for Temple Meads, and the Arriva XC 1P00 0520 service to Cardiff Central and 1M25 0700 Cardiff Central - Manchester Piccadilly (back via Bristol), these both being cancelled. The trailing bogie came off the track whilst the set was believed to be making its way from the fuel tank (Gloucester) siding and caused problems on the nearby 'up main' line which had to be closed whilst initial safety checks took place. Two other services were cancelled as the allocated sets were trapped behind the derailed train, these being; the 1M21 0700 Temple Meads - Manchester Piccadilly and 1M29 0900 Bristol TM -Manchester Piccadilly. The unit was finally fully re-railed for an examination at 1635. There were unusually three morning container train departures from Bristol Railport, with 66420 and 66570 working the 4L31 0900 - Felixstowe and 4L32 1100 - Tilbury (which loco worked which train remained unconfirmed) and 66565 on an 'additional' 1200 - Southampton Maritime. The latter had arrived earlier in the morning being recorded passing Bath at 0830 (20 early) from Southampton.
- Another report for the day was the appearance of test unit 950001 running as 2Q08 0511 Derby RTC Bristol TM (1320) being recorded passing Yate at 1027 (52 early) and Filton Abbeywood 1050 (57 early). The set continued to the West Country as 2Q08 0624 Bristol TM Taunton (1514) via Whatley Quarry, Frome, Merehead Quarry and Castle Cary during the following day.

28/03 70804 having run 0804 Westbury - Kingsland Road S & T light and noted passing Bath at 0835 (4 early), failed at its destination whilst coupling to the rake of 10 new log carrying wagons stored here. A 'not to be moved' board and a red marker lamp were soon put into position awaiting the arrival of rescue loco 70805 which ran 1330 Cardiff Canton - Kingsland Road (1503) being recorded passing East Usk at 1420 and Patchway 1443 (11 late). The locos left light together without the wagons (arriving Westbury at 1633), the originally planned 6270 0928 to Eastleigh TRSMD (via Chandlers Ford) working being cancelled. Later, 57315 + 57314 arrived with a 5254 0838 Carnforth - Bristol Kingsland Road (1653) rail tour ecs move which was reported passing Maindee North junction at 1532 (2 late) and Filton Abbey Wood at 1620 (1 late).

The stock was moved as 5Z55 0407 Kingsland Road - Newport ecs during the following day for a 'Settle & Carlisle Statesman' 1Z55 0524 working to Carlisle returning as 1Z56 1520 Carlisle - Newport being then moved as 5Z56 2356 ecs to Gloucester (for overnight stabling) and 5Z57 ecs to Southall via the Stroud Valley and Kemble during the following day. Test unit 950001 returned from the West Country as 2Q08 0930 Westbury - Derby RTC (1627) via a Weston-super-Mare reverse departing here at 1046 (1 early) and passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1144 (-).

- **30/03** With the Westerleigh junction Standish junction line closed all Arriva XC services were routed via a reverse at Newport and the Chepstow mainline to and from Gloucester. Other Sunday service changes for the day was the termination of Cardiff Portsmouth services at Westbury and a reduced service operating between Bridgwater and Taunton due to flood damage repairs.
- 31/03 37682 + 37402 top n' tailed a 1Z14 1004 Derby RTC Bristol TM (1515) test working (with dept c/stock; 977986, 72630, 72630, 977997), being reported passing Burton-on-Trent at 1142 (69 late) and Yate 1320 (3 late).
- **02/04** The Class 37 hauled test working continued as 1Q13 1706 Bristol Tm Bristol TM (0201) booked via several South Wales branch lines over night including Merthyr, Treherbert and Barry Island as well as a reverse at Bridgend. The working was reported as passing Lawrence Hill at 1726 (2 early) and Patchway 1740 (-) on the outward.
- 04/04 66007 + 66013 + 66201 working as 0W02 1845 Margam Westbury (2151) light locos, passed Patchway at 2052 (4 early), Keynsham 2109 (7 early) and Trowbridge 2135 (6 early).
- 150002 arrived in Bristol as empty stock during the afternoon for a further 'hire' period, running as 5Z11 Reading TCD - St.Phillips Marsh (being reported passing Reading West at 1145) A West Coast operated stock move of 8 further HST second class coach conversions from catering vehicles operated as 5Z00 0555 Kilmarnock Barclays - Laira depot (1917) and top n' tailed with blue livery 57313 + West Coast maroon 47746. Train reports were as follows; Carlisle 0757, departing Crewe at 1239, passing Wem 1302 (6 late), Pilning 1545 (3 early), Filton Abbey Wood 1553 97 early), Parsons Street 1608 (4 early), Bridgwater 1636 (13 early), Exeter St.Davids 1715 (51 early), Dawlish 1728 (53 early) and Newton Abbot 1739 (54 early). The locos returned as 5Z00 1050 Laira - Southall WCR via Castle Cary and the Westbury avoiding line with the barrier vehicles 6330 + 80204 during the following day. A Great Western back to back HST power car movement, running as 0Z74 0710 Laira - St. Phillips Marsh (0955) was formed with 43133 + 43136 passing Worle junction at 0929 (1 late). Three engineering train reports were; 66089 - 6W01 1830 Westerleigh junction - Oxford Hinksey yard (2030) departing Yate with track panels at 1749 and passing Bath at 1852 (19 early), 66087 + 66101 top n' tailing -

- 7W02 1854 Westerleigh junction Westbury yard (which included a Colas twin jib train), reported passing Lawrence Hill at 1951 (44 late) and 66122 6W04 0844 Westbury Standish junction (1300) via Newport ADJ and Chepstow. An evening steam arrival was 44871 with support coach 35508 as 5Z90 2006 Cardiff Pengam sidings St.Phillips Marsh depot passing Patchway at 1931 (84 early) and Lawrence Hill at 1945 (78 early). The loco had arrived in Cardiff on a 1Z89 working from Manchester Victoria (via the Central Wales line), West Coast 47245 returning the train to Manchester, having been attached to the rear.
- **06/04** Returning engineering train reports included; $66174-6W07\ 1005$ Standish junction Oxford Hinksey yard (1623) via the Berks & Hants route (reported passing Saltford, near Bath at 1233) and $66134-6W09\ 1010$ Standish junction Westbury yard (formed of MRA side tipplers).
- **08/04** The final loco of the current Class 70 fleet made its Bristol area debut working a 6C50 2335 (Mon) Westbury Westbury (0643) departmental (via a loco run round at Abergavenny, booked from 0312 0342) the outward passing Filton Abbey Wood at 0303 (144 late) and the return through Bath at 0552 (14 early).
- **09/04** Test unit 950001 departed as 2Q08 0757 Bristol TM Didcot (1147) passing Parkway at 0818 (2 late). Later, West Coast 47237 passed Parkway light at 1226 (29 early) as 0Z80 1025 Southall WCR Cardiff. Colas 56113 worked a further train of log empties as 6V54 0540 Chirk Kronospan Exeter Riverside New yard being reported at Hereford at 0728, passing Patchway at 0852 (1 early), departing Temple Meads at 0925 (12 late), passing Uphill junction at 0951 (3 late) and Highbridge at 0957.

Westbury

- 19/03 This location continues to be a good area to view the new Colas Class 70s in action. 70801 worked the 6M50 0755 Westbury Bescot departmental formed of OCA and MRA wagons being noted passing Hawkridge junction at 0809. 60045 which had arrived on 17/03 behind 66096 on the 6V41 departmental trip from Eastleigh, was present in one of the yards whilst 08799 was noted having replaced 08752 (which moved to Toton) as area shunting pilot.
- 20/03 70805 powered the 6M50 0755 departmental service to Bescot. 70801 + 70803 were in still in Devon at Dawlish on an engineering working from Westbury.
- 22/03 70802 and 70803 had arrived on a return 6Z70 1108 Dawlish Westbury engineers ballast train from Exeter and were right down the bottom of the south yard. 70804 also stabled at the top of the yard near station. 70802 and 70803 came out of yard and stopped just down from station about 1350 and eventually departed as a light loco pair to Bescot via Melksham, Swindon, Didcot, Oxford and Leamington Spa about 1430. Another loco stabled in south yard at 1315 was 59203, which later began performing shunting operations. In the far PW yard north of main line 08799 and 59204 were stabled. 66088 arrived on PW train (rails) at 1324 and reversed its train into south yard, later departing light loco back in the Eastleigh direction about 1415. 66207, 66167 and 66107 arrived as 0012 Margam Eastleigh East yard light loco move at 1413. 70801 was reported as being at Eastleigh and 70805 at Cardiff Canton.
- 25/03 70804 worked the 6M50 0755 Westbury Bescot (via Oxford Hinksey yard) departmental, leaving 70802 and 70803 stabled at Westbury. 70805 remained stabled on Cardiff Canton during the day.
- 31/03 GBRf have taken over the 6M40 1156 (MTWFO) Westbury VQ Cliffe Hill / Stud Farm loaded IOA ballast wagons (1947) and 6V14 2233 return to Westbury (0452) empties from Freightliner Heavy-haul, this being the first date for the new operator. 66742, having arrived light (0V40) from Eastleigh, took out the first working departing at 1158 (2 late). The train still taking its normal route via Melksham, Swindon and Oxford. The working is dated to run from 31/03-16/05/14 and 04/04-16/05/14 (FO). 01/04 70805 worked the 6M50 departmental to Bescot, whilst 66742 was on

the 6M40 Stud Farm ballast. 70801 + 70803 returned a 6C71 0904 Exeter St. Thomas - Westbury Down yard engineers. The locos had worked west on separate 6C72 and 6C71 departmentals to the Dawlish area on 29/03.

- 02/04 At 1150, 66618 + 66515 + 66555 were ready to depart as a 0Y30 light loco move to Stoke Gifford whilst 66742 worked the 6M40 Stud Farm loaded ballast. 08799 with 70801 (allocated 6Z30 to Eastleigh), 70802 and 70803 were stabled in the yards.
- 03/04 57310 was 'hired in' to work the 6M40 Westbury Stud Farm departmental in place of the booked GBRf 66/7. The Class 57 did a repeat performance during the following day. 70802 was on the 6M50 Bescot departmental, being reported passing Swindon at 0850.
- **06/04** 70803 and 70805 were both reported as working on Sunday engineering trains in the Swindon area.
- 07/04 66846 + 70805 worked the morning 6M50, actually running as 7X50 due to the conveyance of side loading point slinger wagons (as well as a Colas crane) passing Swindon at 0859.

- 20/03 56113 passed East Usk at 1000 with the 6Z42 Newport Docks Llanwern steel trip.
- 30/03 66080 top n' tailing 66037 worked a 6W10 1808 Bescot downside Bescot downside (via Ebbw Vale and Machen) departmental departed Newport at 2103 (-) on the outward working.
- 31/03 66095 + ECR 66212 passed at 1734 with the 6E30 Margam Middlesbrough freight service. Two other ECR French locos were reported to be at Margam, these being 66218 and 66224 which were reported to have arrived via the 6V13 steel service from Dollands Moor during the morning. 56113 returned steel wagons to Long Marston from Newport (via a loco run round at Worcester), the short Newport dock 'export' contract from Llanwern having ended.
- **03/04** 56113 passed East Usk at 1400 with BYA, JSA and IHA wagons for Llanwern, (for a later move back to Long Marston), later returning at 1440 light-engine, assumed for Cardiff.
- 10/04 The Holyhead 'Wag Express' was reported as formed; 67002, with c/sock; 10259, 12178, 12179, 12181, 82308. In Alexandra Dock junction yard, 31285 with a 3 coach test train was present, one coach; 9523 being identified.
- 14/04 56302 returned the remaining 'off contract' steel hoods as 6Z30 1130 Llanwern Exchange sidings Long Marston, with the usual loco runround at Worcester. The train was recorded leaving the steel works sidings and onto the South Wales mainline at 1129.

07/06 The Class 40 Preservation Society are using their loco 345 (40145) with West Coast stock on a Rawtensall (East Lancs Railway) - Oxford circular, the outward being routed via Stafford, Bescot, Kidderminster, Worcester, Gloucester New yard, Stroud, Kemble, Swindon and Didcot (Foxhall curve). The return is to run via Charlbury, Evesham and Worcester for the same route back to the East Lancs Railway.

Avon Valley Railway Diesel Gala (12-13/04/14) R.W.Giles / C.Weeks Following a successful visit of Class 14 D9521 (from the Dean Forest Railway) last year, 08822 in First Group blue, from First Great Western, St.Phillips Marsh depot and D3668 (09004), in BR blue, from the Swindon & Cricklade Railway were visitors for this years event. The usual intense timetable operated over the two days with double-headed passenger and freight workings, with home based locos, 07010 (D2994) in BR blue, 31130 Calder Hall Power Station in coal sector trainload and dmu set Sc52006 + Sc52025 in BR green. The coaching stock in use over the weekend was; 35255, 25040, 25299, 3745 whilst the 'demo' freight was made up of 12 ton vans; 783354, 80703, 783717, 783739 and empty 'dogfish' ballast wagons; 983584 and 983583. Other visit notes were; the recent arrival of track machine 73307, whilst the Polish tank Karel (4015/54) departed on the same lorry trailer, believed for overhaul at the Flour Mill, Bream (Forest of Dean). WD70043 (AB 358/41), in black livery, was observed carrying its name Grumpy (neatly applied on the body side close to the nose end) whilst the under frame of Ruston diesel 252823/47 (off track, in a tidy yellow livery) was noted track side (with other stored items of equipment and

coach bogies) near the Cherry Garden lane over bridge in the cutting alongside a tender painted in green, which appeared to be in two halves, possibly from 4F 44123? The restoration of former Fry's Keynsham Chocolate factory Sentinel 7492/28 was noted as progressing well within the goods shed with body parts now painted blue. The boiler, which is currently believed off site, could be steamed later this year. A new feature for the centre at Bitton during the weekend, was organized guided stock yard visits.

On 13/04 08822 was noted loaded at 1830 on to its road transport, returning home via Warmley, and then unconfirmed as via the A4174 ring road and the M32 off at junction 1 for St. Phillips Marsh HST depot.

Dean Forest Railway

22/03 Great Western set 150244 made a guest appearance for the lines dmu special weekend gala, working inwards and return direct via the up and down loop from the mainline each way as 2Z11 1000 Gloucester - Lydney junction (1037) and the 2Z12 1550 return from Lydney junction, which used platform 3 on arrival at Gloucester at 1626 (-).

East Lancashire Railway

On $25^{\rm th}$ to $27^{\rm th}$ July the line is holding a Class 14 event to mark the 50th Anniversary of their construction. It is hoped to bring in no less than 10 locos for a special weekend of workings.

GWS Didcot

03/04 56312 hauled steam 60163 Tornado as 5Z51 1000 Barrow Hill - Didcot (1819) being reported passing Reading at 1748 (1 early). A second steam loco 60007 Sir Nigel Gresley worked 5Z92 1145 Southall WCR - Didcot (with support coach 21096) arriving Reading at 1256 (6 early) and departing 1230 (1 early). A special 'mini mainline loco gathering' event took place during the following weekend, the A4 being also used on rail tours to the West Country over the following weeks.

Burnham-on-Sea, Somerset

A buffer stop recovered from the former ROF Puriton ammunition factory site and currently in store, is to be placed close to the old station area in the town. A location has been chosen on a small pebbled area at the junction of Pier Street and the Esplanade, the Buffer Stop Memorial project (which was set up in 2011) having now raised enough funds to complete the proposed scheme, although planning permission is still outstanding. Little remains of the once Somerset & Dorset Railway station here which was closed to passengers on 29th October 1951 by the Great Western Railway, although special excursion trains continued to visit up until 20th May 1963.

08/04 Class 37 37275 / 6975 (in blue livery) southbound M5 passing junction 16 (Aztec West, Bristol) at 0915 and later being noted in Taunton Deane services at 1115.

09/04 Steam 30120 southbound M5, Taunton Deane services at 1655.

Grounded Bodies

Three former GW 12 ton van bodies have been reported in use as an office and workshop at Hampton Bishop, near Hereford for a local slate business. They are all in excellent condition, carrying a smart grey livery with neat window fittings having been purchased from Rotherwas (near Hereford) in the 1960s. One is identified as GW 93477.

MISCELLANEOUS

Bristol Area News

Bank stabilization work is being under taken at several locations. At Uphill cutting, near Weston-super-Mare, alongside Brunel's 'Devils Bridge' (believed to be the highest single span brick built bridge in the country), Bam Ritchie engineers have nearly completed a project which has seen up to 40 staff clearing vegetation, pumping strengthening cement into bank sections and fitting 2000 securing ties. A similar operation is underway at Newton-st-Loe, near Bath, between the occupation bridge on the Bristol side of Twerton Tunnel and the A4 road overbridge. Meanwhile, £1.5 million has been allocated for drainage work at Flax Bourton cutting an area prone to flooding in the past. An overflowing drainage culvert which passes under the railway from the nearby A370 Bristol - Weston road which forms a link with the River Yeo has been an issue with excess water channelled off the hillside also flooding the road. This work is due to start in May and take 16 weeks to complete and is one of 10 transport locations throughout the country recognized by the Government for improvements.

The clock tower frontage at Temple Meads was bathed in purple light during the evening of 12th April as part of a Lynx deodorant company promotion. Several famous buildings around the country (including Tower Bridge in London) were similarly treated this also including the projection of the CND symbol for Nuclear Disarmament in white light, which formed part of the make love not war publicity campaign. The station was due to pass from a Great Western to Network Rail operation from 01/04/14.

Dawlish - Seawall Report

24/03 66552 + 66953 top n' tailed a 6Y40 1330 Westbury - Exeter St. Thomas (1600) train of 20 autoballasters with material for use on the damaged sea wall. At 0056 (Tues), 66552 became the first loco to cross the replacement track over the filled and repaired breach, although 66953 on the rear remained on the Dawlish Warren side of the work area. Coals Track machine 75406 was still active in the Dawlish station area during the day. 25/03 66552 + 66953 returned the 20 wagon train as 0800 Exeter St. Thomas - Westbury, being noted in the Taunton area just over an hour early with 5 wagons still loaded. The trains ballast was confirmed as dropped on the up line. It is interesting to note, that the public footpath along the seawall has remained closed from Langstone Rock (next to the Red Rock café) near Dawlish Warren through to the Dawlish station and the first tunnel at Kennaway due to safety issues.

29/03 66606 + 66555 (6Y75) with 66528 (6Y74) and 66515 (6Y73) were in the Dawlish area, along with 70801 and 70803 on engineers trains.

30/03 70801 (6C72) and 70803 (6C71) were present near Teignmouth. A controlled landslide had taken place here with water jets clearing an unsafe over hanging rock face, taking advantage of 'additional' work

whilst this section of line remained closed.

03/04 66953 worked light from Dawlish Warren - Newton Abbot and back as a 'test' run over the newly laid track work. 70804 returned from Dawlish Warren around 1710 as 0Z70 light-engine to Westbury having also covered the repaired track after the Class 66.

04/04 With a ceremony taking place in the station car park at Dawlish, Prime Minister David Cameron officially reopened the railway, after 56 days of closure. He praised the NR / Great Westerners 'orange army', the men numbering around 300 who worked day and night and featured on tv advertisements or in the national press rebuilding the breached 3.5 miles of line using around 2,000 tonnes of concrete and 150 tonnes of steel. The first workings over the line (with the Dawlish passing time in brackets) were;

5Z66 0011 Exeter St.Davids - Laira (Arriva XC) 220002 + 221119 down (0016) and 5Z46 0011 Newton Abbot - Exeter St.Davids (Great Western) 150131 move up (0017). The first passenger train to call was; 143611 + 143621 calling with the 2T03 0534 Exeter St.Davids - Paignton Great Western service. Following 'mainline' north bound reports were; 220013 - 1S37 0520 Plymouth - Edinburgh Waverley, 43165 + 43194 - 1A75 0530 Plymouth - Paddington, 43176 + 43195 - 1A09 0543 Plymouth - Paddington and 221134 - 1S39 0625 Plymouth - Glasgow Central and 221119 - 1S41 0725 Plymouth - Edinburgh Waverley. Westbound Great Western firsts were reported as; 43148 + 43151 - 1C73 0706 Paddington - Paignton and 43042 + 43168 - 1C04 0730 Paddington - Penzance.

10/04 The first rail tour to cover the repaired section was steam 60007 Sir Nigel Gresley with Steam Dreams 'Surrey & Hampshire Cathedrals Express' excursion (1232 0704 Woking - Kingswear and 1233 1630 return) which passed Dawlish at 1336 (-) and 1800 (24 late) on the return. 47746 powered the train to and from Westbury where the A4 took over. The steam loco had run 5232 0610 loco and support coach from GWS Didcot (returning 5234 2115 to Southall) and on the Torbay Steam Railway, Class 25 diesel 25185 worked the train between Churston and Kingswear so the loco could use the turntable. The c/stock formation was reported as; 99122, 99350, 99371, 1666, 5249, 5237, 13440, 9104, 5171, 5236, 5222. Loco support coach 21096 was unconfirmed as forming part of the train.

The mainline was again set to close from Saturday 26/04 - Monday 28/04 whilst signalling repairs were due to be completed. The up line is reported to remain open for two booked rail tours to pass during the closure period. The damaged track work and closure has started a debate as to whether a line should be reinstated as a secondary route in North Devon connecting the current terminus of a freight line from Crediton (on the Barnstaple branch line from Cowley Bridge junction) to Meldon Quarry / Okehampton (which continues to see a selected Sunday Summer Sundays Great Western service from Exeter) with Plymouth, via Tavistock. A major costly rebuilding project would be the steel viaduct near Meldon, a listed structure currently only in use as a cycle path, along with compulsory order purchasing of several properties whose land is now occupying the old former LSWR track bed closed in the 1960s.

High Speed 2 - How the West will lose!

Analysts predict Bristol and Cardiff could fall short regarding new improved rail connections with the north even though a new £5 billion Great Western Mainline electrification project is due to be completed in three years time. Better traveling times from the Capital could see new businesses and job opportunities set up along the HS2 (if approved) corridor over the coming years which will see times from Manchester

reduced from 128 minutes to 68 minutes, Leeds from 132 to 72 minutes and Birmingham from 81 to 48 minutes. Bristol, which is one of 50 areas highlighted for a negative trend due to the HS2 project, will see a reduced journey time from 120 to 100 minutes, once electrification is completed. However, campaigners against the HS2 project, following an in depth study, suggest the proposed 225 mph running speed should be reduced to 185 mph thus providing an optimum reduction in carbon emissions at the lower speed, this would however increase the projected travel times between cites by 10 minutes.

Ashford Chart Leacon

29/03 The final rail movement was due to take place from works following its closure. The works which originally built wagons and coaches carried out maintenance work on the former Southern Region emu and demu fleet and latterly dealt with wagons including cranes and snow ploughs in more recent times.

Freight Boost

DB Schenker Rail (UK) is reported to be employing around 100 new drivers throughout the UK over the coming months. In the local area, 3 are to be taken on at Margam and 7 at Westbury.

Class 60

Although the planned sale of 20 long time stored, DBS owned locos was believed cancelled, Colas Rail freight are now reported to be in the process of acquiring several class members with 60087 set aside at Toton depot to act as a 'test bed' for refurbishment modifications. As well as 60087, 60002, 60026, 60047, 60056, 60076, 60085, 60087, 60095 and 60096 (located at St.Blazey) are expected to be the other locos involved, although more could be purchased. DBS Toton is to maintain the Colas Class 60 loco fleet as part of the deal. As the Magazine went to press, 60021 is to become the first class member overhaul with a further four to be completed by the end of 2014. Five more will be refurbished during 2015. Locos; 60047, 60056, 60076, and 60095, along with 60062 are all located at Crewe Diesel depot.

New Locos - Class 68

Reports suggest Chiltern Trains are to swap their DBS Class 67s with DRS 68 locos later this year. The locos, which have a better haulage capacity, will to be constructed at the Vossiohs Plant, Valencia, Spain and numbered as 68010 - 68015. They will be maintained at Chiltern's Wembley and Stourbridge depots, with heavy exams taking place at the DRS Crewe Gresty Bridge or Kingmoor facilities. Chiltern will be able to add an extra coach to its passenger train operation out of Marylebone to Birmingham and Kidderminster using the new locos. 68003, 68004 and 68005 arrived at Liverpool Gladstone dock on 15/04 (not Seaforth as has been previously used) and shunted by 37609 which hauled the three locos as a 0Z38 move to Crewe Gresty bridge during the following day. A Pathfinder Tours trip from Eastleigh - Crewe for the DRS Gresty Bridge depot open day on 19/07 will see one of these locos as hauling power. The route is to be via Salisbury, Westbury, Bath, the Severn Tunnel and the Marches route to Hereford.

Road Movements (local area times recorded where known)

20/03 HST coach, 44020 southbound.
