Although trip timings and costs advertised are based on Bristol area departures, fuel/train fare to an advertised departure point from Cardiff and Newport will be paid by the Society upon agreement with the Events Organiser. If you live outside the areas served by these points but on route for a trip please contact Roy Morris to arrange a pick up point that is mutually convenient.

A child is a person who has not yet reached their seventeenth birthday and is still in full time education. People who are not Society members or family members will have their fares increased by the trip-member rate (£3 per day).

- 3. The discounts highlighted above for family members refer to travel costs only. Accommodation, and permits / admission fees will be charged at cost price.
- 4. Members who wish to go on a trip must contact John Dicks prior to the book by date to confirm that they still intend to go on the trip.
- 5. Where a trip is organised with an itinerary to a specific area, it may sometimes be possible to drop off a member en route. This is known as the Trip Flyer option. NOTES & NEWS

Bristol Parkway, Stoke Gifford, Pilning, Yate and Westerleigh

19/04 All First/GW services were diverted via Filton, Dr.Days curve, Bath and Box during the day, adding up to 45 minutes journey time, due to engineering work between Royal Wootton Bassett and Westerleigh junction. The Colas 6V62 1100 (WSO) Tilbury (Riverside) - Llanwern Exchange sidings (1732) steel service with 56302 was delayed at Acton Mainline having arrived at 1225 for a booked 1241 departure, but there was no relief driver available. The working was eventually reported passing Slough at 1756 (278 late), Swindon 1922 (215 late), Bath 1953 (215 late) and Patchway 2016 (216 late). Earlier, the 6B13 1127 (SO) Theale - Margam empty fuel tanks with 60039 had, also been diverted passing Chippenham 1311 (88 early), Keynsham 1333 (88 early) and Patchway 1426 (54 early). The Saturdays Only, 0X12 Margam LIP - Westbury loco convoy was formed with; 66009 + 66182 + 66014 + 66104 + 66044 + 66074 (the first two having been added at Newport ADJ) and reported passing East Usk at 1245 (7 early) and Bath 1401 (2 late).

20/04 Rail tour stock for the following day's Pathfinder Tours excursion was treble headed as ecs from Crewe - Whitchurch (Salop) where an 'extra' 1Z57 1057 departure to Eastleigh with 37612 + 37611 + 47810 was operated. The working was reported as arriving Hereford at 1217 and departing at 1222 (1 late), passing Severn Tunnel Junction at 1333 (13 late), arriving Filton Abbey Wood at 1348 (9 late) and departing at 1350 (9 late), passing Keynsham at 1404 (11 late) and Dean 1514 (4 late). The train's full choc/cream livery c/stock formation was reported as; 21272, 3098, 1671, 3100, 3122, 3112, 1813, 4998, 4991, 4949.

21/04 Easter Bank Holiday Monday - 37611 + 37612 passed back through the area working Pathfinder Tours 'The Heart of Wales Meanderer' (1Z49 0707 Eastleigh - Llandrindod Wells via Gloucester and 1Z50 1646 return via the

Severn Tunnel) with the same coaching stock as recorded the previous day, except with generator van 6313 added. Reports included departing Warminster at 0818 (-) and Bath 0900 (5 late), passing Lawrence Hill at 0914 (4 late), Yate 0932 (-) and Severn Tunnel junction 1032 (-). The lead loco was reported as carrying 'bunny ears'! Another report for the day was 66597 + 66555 which had arrived in Stoke Gifford sidings light at 1525 (12 late) as a 0Y24 0837 working from Hoo junction via Eastleigh, Westbury and Bath at 1449 (30 early).

- 37612 + 37611 returned the previous days rail tour ecs as a passenger trip to Whitchurch only (as on the outward run on 20/04). Running as 1249 1316 Eastleigh - Whitchurch (Salop) the train carried a hand full of passengers, mainly in the front coach and was reported departing 6 late and passing Westbury 1440 (10 late), Bath 1507 (15 late), departing Filton Abbey Wood at 1532 (12 late), passing Patchway at 1535 (12 late) and East Usk 1600 (14 late). A booked reverse move at Newport (1558 - 1620) did not however take place - reason unknown. The stock formation was the same as the previous day with the addition of former Virgin red coaches 6054 + 5952 tagged to the rear as a stock transfer from Eastleigh - Crewe. A 1Z01 1148 Derby RTC - Bristol Parkway test train formed with 37688 + 37402 in a top n' tail formation with dept c/stock; 72639, 977974, 9516, 72616 was in trouble in the Birmingham area, passing Washwood Heath at 1352 (65 late), Longbridge 1708 (238 late) and Gloucester Yard junction 2133 (257 late). Despite the late running a booked visit to Sharpness was still believed to have taken place on route. The following 1853 Parkway - South Wales working taking in Merthyr, Tower, Treherbert and Barry Island (0326) was reported cancelled. Another test train in the area was 31465 with dept c/stock; 6262, 62287, 9702 running as 3Z18 1530 Derby RTC - Bristol TM high level sidings via Yate, Parkway and a reverse in Temple Meads departing at 1856 (8 early) and Swindon at 2107 (44 early) returning through Bath at 2200 (52 early) to Bristol. At 1600 Stoke Gifford 'down side' held; 66504, 66514, 66518, 66539 (on coal empties), 66558, 66597. East Coast HST power car 43290 was hired in by Arriva XC (working with set XC01 and 43357) to work the 1V60 1105 Edinburgh Waverley - Exeter St.Davids service being reported departing Parkway at 1725 (4 late). The booked return was the 1E75 1924 Exeter St.Davids - Leeds, on which 43290 led the train.
- **29/04** 66555 + 66519 + 66561 were a morning arrival as a 0Y50 0720 light loco move from Westbury Stoke Gifford being recorded passing Keynsham at 0837.
- 01/05 66605 passed Yate at 1738 (6 late) with 6Z78 1338 Bardon Hill Quarry Cardiff Tidal sidings (1843) engineering stock pile ballast.
- **02/05** Having arrived with D6700 on the Severn Valley Railway the previous day from the NRM York, 55002 The Kings Own Yorkshire Light Infantry made its area mainline local debut as 0Z56 0831 Kidderminster (SVR) Swanage Railway Motala ground frame (1521) hauling the Class 37 with 47292 (in large logo livery) and HST power car 41001 (43000). Reports for this working included; passing Yate at 1021 (9 early), Parkway 1037 (1 late), Bath 1110 (12 late), departing Westbury at 1147 (43 early) and Salisbury (platform 1) at 1259 (3 early).
- 03/05 With the Gloucester line closed, 60063 + 66142 top n'tailed the 6B13 0504 Robeston Westerleigh (1250), which left 104 minutes early, loaded fuel tanks via the Severn Tunnel (instead of the normal Gloucester route) the train being recorded departing Parkway at 1132 (8 late) and passing Westerleigh Junction at 1140 (9 late), the train later reversing on the Tytherington Quarry branch line. The 6B47 return empties arrived in Parkway at 1803 and later passed Patchway at 1918. Earlier, the

Saturdays Only 0012 1106 Margam LIP - Eastleigh light loco moved was formed; 66005 + 66077 + 66171 + 66120 and noted passing Keynsham at 1345. The locos arrived in Westbury at 1412 departing here 2 minutes later.

Engineering train reports during the day included; 66024 - 6W01 1300 Cardiff East - Westbury Yard, reported passing Lawrence Hill at 1239, 66039 - 6W10 1031 Margam - Hinksey Yard (Oxford) noted passing Pilning at 1257, 66007 - 6W13 0835 Westbury - Cardiff Pengam passing Lawrence Hill at 0921, 66119 - 6W16 0815 Cardiff East - Westbury Yard (via Margam) passing Pilning at 1232, 66524 top n' tail 66597 - 6W17 1100 Cardiff East -Westbury Yard passing Severn Tunnel Junction at 1120 (158 early), Pilning at 1218 (111 early), Patchway 1228 (115 early) and Lawrence Hill 1232. Power problems with the locos on the latter train, in the Severn Tunnel area saw two First/GW passenger services lose time and pass the working 'wrong line' these being; 1L51 1021 Swansea - Paddington HST passing Severn Tunnel Junction at 1155 (10 late) and Patchway 1208 (11 late) and 1F13 1108 Cardiff Central - Portsmouth Harbour Class 158 departing Severn Tunnel Junction at 1202 (22 late) and passing Patchway 1215 (24 late). The return 6Y07 0900 Standish Junction - Taunton Fairwater HOBC which departed 15 early, was top n' tailed with 66547 + 66953 and passed Lawrence Hill at 0953 and Parsons Street at 1012.

- 06/05 66527 with the 6M04 1103 Avonmouth BBHt Rugeley PS (1803) loaded coal service arrived at Patchway station at 1129 (3 late) and departed at 1132 (4 late) following a crew change.
- **07/05** At 1925 Stoke Gifford 'downside' held; 66509, 66515, 66547, 66564 with 66957 stabled on west facing coal empties.
- **09/05** The 6L63 2125 Margam Tilbury steel empties were reported in trouble in South Wales whilst underway and noted passing Llanwern West Junction at 2332 (50 late) headed by 56113 + 56078.
- 10/05 66127 + 66093 + 66061 formed the Saturdays Only, 0012 1108 Margam Eastleigh light loco move being reported as arriving Westbury at 1417 (8 late). The Wednesday and Saturdays Only return 6V62 Tilbury (Riverside) Llanwern steel service was headed by 56113 + 56078 and reported passing Barking at 1348 (141 late), departing Acton at 1500 (139 late), passing Swindon at 1643 (56 late) and Parkway 1729 (54 late). 70801 ran light from Westbury Gloucester to collect 66848 (off Avonmouth coal empties), for weekend engineering work, returning as 0Z75 1933 Gloucester New Yard Westbury (2116) which was recorded as arriving Parkway No 2 goods loop at 1909 (71 early) and departing at 2020 (-). An evening departmental train report was; 66563 6Y08 1720 Oxford (Hinksey Yard) Abbotswood Junction (2240) which departed Parkway at 1925 (3 late) following a crew change, formed with empty JNAs.
- 11/05 A working not often recorded is the Freightliner 6V82 (Sun) Tunstead Westbury Cement Works loaded cement train being reported departing Patchway at 2007 following a crew change behind 66605. This train was worked by 66604 on the previous Sunday.
- 17/05 At 0715, Stoke Gifford 'down side' held; 66539, 66553, 66554, 66602, 66614. 66602 + 66614 later departed as a 0Y27 1403 light-engine move to Newton Abbot (Hackney Yard) passing Dr.Day's Junction at 1424 (12 late), for a return 6Y27 1834 rail train move to Moreton Cutting. Later in the afternoon, 56078 + 56113 passed Patchway at 1544 (64 early) on the 6V62 1100 Tilbury (Riverside) Llanwern Exchange sidings loaded steel, having earlier passed Slough at 1337 (20 early) and Swindon 1505 (42 early).

Locos recorded on tank duty at Westerleigh during the review period have included; 60020/059/063.

Bristol Temple Meads, Barton Hill and Kingsland Road

15/03 Additional Information (April Magazine) - 67024 was confirmed as the VSOE loco in the Bristol East Freight terminal.

05/04 Additional Information (May Magazine) - The 5Z00 0555 Kilmarnock Barclays - Laira depot refurbished HST stock move with locos 57313 + 47746 was formed with coaches; 80204 (barrier vehicle), 42259, 44036, 42285, 42202, 42003, 42284, 41138, 41137, 6330 (barrier vehicle).

Compass Tours operated 'The Devonian' 1288 0739 Southport -Paignton and 1Z89 1709 return top n' tailed with 47813 + 47853 and c/stock; 3356, 3397, 3426, 3390, 3384, 1200, 5961, 5987, 5955, 6024, 17105, being reported as passing Pilning at 1206 (-), departing Temple Meads at 1232 (-), passing Uphill junction at 1259 (6 early), having missed out a booked 1250 - 1257 Yatton loop stop, passing Bridgwater at 1308 (8 early). The return departed to time and was recorded passing Bridgwater at 1845 (3 early). Two freight report for the day were the 6M63 Bridgwater - Crewe nuclear flasks headed by 20302 + 37425 (with FNAs 550051 + 550038) and reported as departing at 1206, passing Highbridge & Burnham at 1216 and Barton Hill at 1304 and 56302 on a load 8, 6V54 0540 Chirk Kronospan - Teigngrace log empty working (a return back to this location from the Exeter loading point) being reported departing Hereford at 0821 (53 late), passing Pilning at 0943 (61 late), Filton Abbey Wood at 0954 (54 late), Bristol TM 1004 (48 late) and Bridgwater 1047 (50 late). Arrival at Heathfield prior to a loco run round and a return back up the branch to the loading area was at 1431(50 late). On Barton Hill depot, Arriva/Wales dmu set 142010 was reported as present for overhaul. 56302 returned the 6M54 Teigngrace - Chirk loaded log train which was reported departing Exeter St.Davids at 1109 (27 late) to collect a further 10 loaded wagons from nearby Riverside yard. What was reported to be suffering low power problems prior to departure saw the loco removed from the now 18 wagon loaded train, 56113 running 0Z56 0930 Cardiff Canton - Exeter (passing Pilning at 1036 - 7 early) to take the train forward. The eventual departure from Exeter Riverside Yard was at 1349 (78 late), then passing Taunton at 1437 (69 late), Worle 1507 (70 late), Narroways Hill Junction (Bristol) 1545 (29 late) and Pilning 1608 (16 late). A revived 56302 later follow on light, assumed to Cardiff Canton. Another report for the day was 150001 running as 5Z71 St. Phillips Marsh - Reading Depot, assumed following wheel lathe attention, being noted departing Temple Meads at 1717 (44 late). The set had been noted passing Swindon at 1023 for Bristol during the previous morning.

The Orient Express, now operating as the Belmond British Pullman the new brand for VSOE Hotels Ltd, made its yearly passage through the area for a Cornish weekend visit with 67006 + 67024, arriving in Bristol double-headed and departing in a top n' tail formation. The train running as 1Z78 0944 Victoria - Truro passed Bath at 1245 (-), arrived Temple Meads (platform 6) at 1259 and departed at 1351 (-), passing Worle at 1408 (-) and Bridgwater 1423 (-). The c/stock formation was reported as; 9502, Zena, Vera, Gwen, Cygnus, Perseus, Phoenix, Minerva, Ibis, Audrey, Lucille, 99545. The train was to make its usual Plymouth - Taunton and Plymouth - Exeter / Kingswear trips during the following day. Earlier, the 6M63 Bridgwater - Crewe nuclear flask train with 57012 + 20304 was noted in Highbridge loop at 1135 and passing Bristol West junction at 1218, having departed Bridgwater at 1121 with a single FNA wagon. A test train was reported stabled in the 'old fish dock' area at Temple Meads during the day formed with DRS locos and c/stock; 37402 + 72616, 9516, 977974, 72639 + 37688.

The first of two rail tours via the Bristol area was the 'Somerset Coast Express' (1291 0643 Hooton - Minehead and 1292 1655 return, due Hooton 2321) organized by the Chester Model Railway Club, which was top n' tailed with DRS locos 47853 + 47813 (using c/stock; 9521, 5965, 6137, 6158, 6027, 1212, 3333, 3325, 3344, 3345) being reported passing Lawrence Hill at 1031 (1 early), departing Yatton loop at 1058 (-) and departing Taunton at 1130 (2 early), the return departing Taunton at 1841 (1 late), passing Highbridge & Burnham at 1855 (1 early) and Worle 1903 (-). The second working was preserved mainline Class 52 D1015 Western Champion (displaying D1017 Western Warrior number and nameplates on one side) + D1755 (47773) with Vintage Trains 'Western Devonian' 1Z15 0625 Tyselev Steam Trust - Kingswear (1230) and 1Z52 1700 return to Tyseley Steam Trust (2230), the outward being recorded passing; Gloucester Yard Junction at 0837 (3 early), Yate 0858 (3 early), departing Bristol TM at 0951 (-) and passing Worle at 1007 (1 early) and the return passing Taunton at 1859 (-) and Highbridge & Burnham at 1920. Another morning move into the area was; West Coast 47245 + steam locos 5029 Nunney Castle + 44932 (with support coach W35461) as 5Z80 0552 Southall - St. Phillips Marsh HST depot (0907) being reported passing Wootton Bassett at 0825 (40 late). Both steam locos were for rail tour use, 47245 later departing as 5Z86 0935 St. Phillips Marsh - Plymouth hauling 5029 Nunney Castle and support coach which departed Temple Meads at 0942 and passed Long Ashton at 1027 and Taunton 1103. The steam loco continued onwards from Exeter to Plymouth being later collected by 34046 Braunton (with support coach S35451) running as 5Z83 1438 Exeter to St.Blazey for overnight stabling prior to 'Great Britain' rail tour duty during the following day. Braunton had brought in the first leg of the 'Great Britain VII' into Exeter as 1282 0745 ex Victoria the former LSWR via Yeovil and Honiton. 47746 + 47245, meanwhile top n' tailed the tour onwards as 1283 1450 Exeter St.Davids - Truro for the overnight

27/04 An unusual ex. SR and GW steam combination of 5029 Nunney Castle + 34046 Braunton completed Day 2 of this year's Great Britain VII (1Z85 0901 St. Austell - Bristol TM via Falmouth) with c/stock; W35461, S35451, 3093 Florence, 99712, 99127 Christina, 99125 Jessica, 13320 Anna, Emerald (Pullman 326), 99316, 99122 Alexandra, 3058 Florence (a second coach carrying the same name!), 99723 with 47746 attached to the rear. Train reports included; arriving Falmouth Dock at 0958 (2 late), departing at 1002 (4 late), passing Liskeard at 1134 (8 late), Totnes 1337 (2 late), Bridgwater 1615 94 early) and arriving Temple Meads at 1655 (9 early). Also the Belmond British Pullman returned as 1Z83 1220 Truro - London Victoria (2006) double-headed with 67024 + 67006 which departed to time passing Taunton 1539 (1 late), Bridgwater 1548 (-), Yatton 1605 (-), arriving Temple Meads at 1619 (2 late) and departing at 1705 (10 late) as a top n' tail formation, later passing Bath at 1718 (11 late) and Trowbridge 1734 (10 late), With 43180 failed at Worcester with a serious traction motor problem, the second power car 43127 was given the task to move the remaining coaches as 5Z74 1057 to St. Phillips Marsh (via Hereford) being reported passing East Usk at 1215 and Stapledon Road 1336. For the record, the stock formation was recorded as; 44076, 42108, 42092, 42093, 42094, 40803, 41166, 41163. Over at St. Phillips Marsh, steam 44932 was stabled in the company of shunting locos 08663 Jack and 08822 John. An engineering train report was; 66035 top n' tailing 66024 - 6W08 0815 Pontypridd - Westbury Yard (1433) formed of MHAs and passing Cardiff Ninian Park at 1221 (7 early) and Stapledon Road 1329 (15 early). The 'Great Britain VII' continued its journey as 1270 0816 Bristol TM - Grange-over-Sands (1720) behind steam 44871 (46233 Duchess of

Sutherland - now in a BR green livery - having been in the frame for this part of the journey a few days earlier but had suffered a failure) departing to time and passing Pilning at 0837 (4 late). The support loco, 47746 had left as a 0Z72 0755 Bristol TM - Preston (1322) light-engine move, passing Pilning at 0820 (2 early). Over at Bristol West Railport, 66414 arrived as a 0V32 Southampton Maritime light-engine move, taking out the 4L32 1100 departure to Tilbury with 66558 as part of the train. Great Eastern 43290 remained 'on hire' to Arriva XC (formed with 43357) working both the 1V44 0600 Leeds - Plymouth and 1S51 1223 Plymouth - Glasgow Central services, the latter departing Temple Meads at 1430. The Monday's only 6C73 Westbury - Taunton Fairwater departmental is still routed via Bristol, 66953 working today's train passing Bridgwater at 1359.

- 29/04 20304 + 37606 were paired on the 6M63 Bridgwater Crewe nuclear flasks being reported passing Parsons Street at 1226 and Lawrence Hill 1234. An evening signalling failure in the Newport area saw some late running through Bristol, including the First/GW 2C87 1800 Cardiff Central Taunton service which missed out several booked stops (including Parsons Street) to recover time.
- 30/04 The 10 IWA 'stored' log wagons in Kingsland Road sidings were booked to be moved for a second time as a 6270 1000 move to Eastleigh East yard (1258). The wagons had arrived on 14/11/13 from Barry, a previous attempt for removal on 28/03/14 being cancelled following an apparent loco failure. 70804 ran 0270 0830 Westbury Kingsland Road light (0926) being reported passing Oldfield Park, Bath at 0913, but after a visit to the yard and train, ran light to Barton Hill (arriving at 1230) for fuel passing through Temple Meads down at 1207 and back at 1215 (via West junction). It was assumed movement was again not to take place, but a new 1400 path to Eastleigh was put in place and following an on time departure the train passed Bath at 1459 (1 late) and Westbury 1518 (2 late). The loco later returned, 0271 1510 Eastleigh Trsmd Westbury down yard (1656) light.
- O2/05 DRS livery 66420 passed Dr.Days junction at 0915 with the 4V30 Tilbury Bristol West Railport container service, which has been in the past routed via Box and Bath. Later, 31285 powered a 3Z07 1050 Derby RTC Exeter (Riverside) test train formed with dept c/stock; 62384, 977985, 977986, 62384, 9708 being reported passing Cheltenham at 1345 (1 early), Temple Meads 1452 (7 early) and Bridgwater 1611 (9 early). On the passenger side, Singapore livery 43163 (paired with 43021) worked the First/GW 1A26 1700 Temple Meads Paddington service, departing Bath at 1714 (1 late).
- 03/05 The first First/GW HST South Coast 'relief' working (reported in last months Magazine) was worked by 43040 + 43160 as 1072 0905 Bristol TM Weymouth and 1V67 1644 return. The service is to operate on Saturdays from 24/05 06/09, the departure of the final days working however, has been retimed to 1728. Following overnight West Country mainline activity as far as Lostwithiel, 31285 returned the previous days test train as 3Z01 1000 Exeter (Riverside) Derby RTC being recorded passing Taunton at 1029, Bridgwater 1038 (7 early) and Parkway 1155 (16 early).
- **04/05** From 0100 until 0500 on 06/05 the mainline from Hullavington Junction Bathampton Junction was closed for engineering work which included bridge work in the Thingley area associated with the forthcoming electrification project. Road bus connections were operating to Chippenham and Melksham during the closure period. The First/GW 1F12 0908 Portsmouth Harbour Cardiff Central service was unusually formed with 150239 + 150246 + 158951 on arrival in Temple Meads, where the two Class 150 units were removed.

06/05 20302 + 37601 powered the 6M63 Bridgwater - Crewe nuclear flasks formed of two FNAs which departed at 1203 and passed Parkway at 1316. Later, First/GW HST power car 43015 made a solo transfer move running as 0Z74 1358 Old Oak Common - St. Phillips Marsh, being reported passing Swindon 1648 (5 early), Westerleigh junction 1717 (7 early) and Filton Abbey Wood 1740 (2 late).

07/05 Two engineering train reports were; 66614 - 1038 Cardiff East - Westbury passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1328 (49 late) and 66554 - 1528 Westbury - Cardiff Rhymney River Bridge junction passing Lawrence Hill at 1710 (58 early).

'The Anniversary Limited' (1Z44 0538 Stafford - Westbury) was a Pathfinder Tours / DRS operation headed by 47828 + 47813 being reported passing Yate at 0857 (1 late), departing Parkway at 0920 (4 late) and passing Bath at 0955 (8 late). DBS took over from here with steam 5029 Nunney Castle (which had earlier run 5Z44 0818 Barton Hill - Westbury with W35461) for the 1Z45 1031 leg to Plymouth arriving at 1329 (2 early), where after the loco was turned on the Laira triangle, the train returned as 1Z48 1634 Plymouth - Bristol TM (1923) departing 9 late, later being reported passing Totnes at 1718 (14 late), Exeter St. Thomas 1748 (4 early), Tiverton Parkway 1833 (6 late), Bridgwater at 1854 (3 late) and arriving in Temple Meads platform 3 at 1922 (1 early), for 47813 + 47828 (which had run light from Westbury during the morning) to return the outing as a DRS 1Z49 2007 to Stafford, which departed 3 early and passed Yate at 2030 (6 early). The sell out trip (which used a full choc/cream stock formation; 21272, 3098, 1671, 3122, 3112, 4991, 4949, W35461 being the steam locos support coach in use), commemorated the 50th Anniversary in 1954 of 3440 City of Truro's 100 mph descent of Wellington Bank working the 'Ocean Mail' on May 9th 1904. The actual enthusiasts special ran 50 years ago from Paddington - Plymouth, with 4079 Pendennis Castle, but coal quality issues and a dropped fire box due to heat at Lavington (near Westbury) whilst traveling at 96 mph, saw 6999 Capel Dewi Hall take over and the Castle removed, the Hall later recording a 94 mph passing Curry Rivel, before arrival and replacement at Taunton by 7025 Sudeley Castle. 7027 Clun Castle (which is currently in fact close to a return to mainline) worked the return from Plymouth - Bristol and was given authority for 100 mph over Wellington Bank by the Civil Engineers Department (with a 80 mph restriction specially lifted), but nobody had told the Laira based train crew (who thought the line speed had been raised to 90 not 100 mph) so only 88 mph was reached, but 94 mph was later reported at Norton Fitzwarren west of Taunton, with a quick run onwards to Bristol. 5054 Earl of Ducie (with Denbigh Castle as standby) was provided by St. Phillips Marsh depot, working the return to the Capital from Bristol, via Badminton, with a speed of 96 mph being recorded on this part of the journey! On board reports during the present day journey, restricted to 75 mph (or lower depending on line side restrictions) recorded 62 mph at the foot of Hermerdon Bank (north of Plymouth) the speed falling away to 17 at the summit, then crossing Dainton at 32 mph with a time of 18.5 minutes being recorded between Newton Abbot and Exeter the latter being passed at 64.5mph. 75 mph was achieved before Tiverton Parkway and 55 mph over Whiteball, the Exeter - Taunton section taking only 37 minutes. Wellington to Bristol was a near constant 73 mph dropping to 72 through Parsons Street, in the Bristol suburbs prior to the Temple Meads stop. Later, Dauntsey between Chippenham and Swindon was passed at 74 mph. Another steam loco move during the day was 5043 Earl of Mount Edgcumbe on a 5Z48 1030 Tyseley Loco Works - Laira (1805) rail tour positioning move with two coaches being recorded passing Yate 1312 (29

early), departing Temple Meads at 1330 (33 early) and passing Uphill Junction 1411 (23 early). On the freight side during the day, the 6M63 Bridgwater - Crewe nuclear flasks operated for a second time during the week headed by 57004 + 37610 being reported departing Bridgwater station at 1203 (4 early), passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1300 (-) and Yate 1327 (9 early). The inward 6V73 0055 ex Crewe Coal sidings (due Bridgwater at 0645) was reported passing Nailsea & Backwell station at 0607 (-). A second City of Truro 100 mph Anniversary weekend special this time organized by Vintage Trains as a 10 coach 1Z52 0705 Solihull -Plymouth with D1015 Western Champion (still displaying D1017 Western Warrior plates on one side only) reported passing Bath at 0952 (1 late), Keynsham at 0958 (2 early), departing Temple Meads at 1018 (-), passing Uphill Junction at 1036 (2 early) and Taunton at 1056 (4 early) and steam 5043 Earl of Mount Edgcumbe with the return, again 75 mph restricted, '1 Zulu 48' 1Z48 1510 Plymouth - Solihull (formed of c/stock; W35461 loco support, 21272, 3098, 1671, 3122, 3112, 4991, 4949) which departed 3 early, passing Bridgwater at 1648 (25 early), Yatton 1706 (23 early) and arriving Temple Meads at 1726 (23 early). The return was again routed via Bath onwards from Bristol, being reported passing Keynsham at 1843, 47773 (D1755) being added at Oxford to pilot the steam loco and train back to Birmingham. Meanwhile, the Western had returned the other 4 coaches 9101, 4940, 5157, 5191 (participants were apparently given a choice of return motive power!) as 1Z53 1430 Plymouth - Tyseley Steam Trust, departing 5 late and passing Ivybridge at 1444 (4 early), Exeter St. Davids 1527 (16 early), Bridgwater 1603 (9 early), Yatton 1619 (11 early), departing Temple Meads at 1702 (4 early) and passing Yate at 1750 (2 early). It was interesting to note, as 'unofficial' calculations were near completion, the second of the weekends steam trips with 5043 appeared to have covered the Plymouth - Bristol section in 129 minutes, against 7029 Clun Castles time on 9th May 1964 of 133 minutes 9 seconds which was recorded in the July 1964 edition of Railway World Magazine. It seems another historical event which may well be talked about in years to come could well have been created on this day in 2014.

11/05 $\,$ 66524 + 66597 top n' tailed the return 6Y07 0800 Abbotswood Junction - Taunton Fairwater (1333) HOBC which was reported passing Filton Abbeywood at 1230 (11 late) and Worle Junction and onto the Weston-super-Mare loop (and off route) at 1303 (17 late).

12/05 Both First/GW sleeper services were confirmed as running via the Bristol area, booked to pass just north of Worle Junction, near Westonsuper-Mare. Train details were; 57602 with c/stock - 17174, 12161, 10232, 10534, 10563, 10584, 10532, 10612 (PZ89) - 1A40 2115 (Sun) Penzance - Paddington, reported passing Yatton 0157 (4 early), Bristol TM 0208 (31 early), Bath 0220 (31 early) and Chippenham 0231 (29 early) and 57605 with c/stock - 17173, 12100, 10225, 10590, 10594, 10589, 10619 (PZ88) passing Chippenham at 0128 (5 early), Bath 0138 (8 early), Bristol TM 0148 (11 early) and Yatton 0200 (12 early). Later, Devon & Cornwall Railways 56312 ran 0Z56 0750 Taunton - Lydney (1135) via Gloucester (prior to a return to Derby) passing Bridgwater 0804 (71 early) and Dr.Days Junction 0904 (66 early). The loco had arrived in Taunton as 0Z56 1130 Willesden Euro-Operations - Taunton (1538) via the Berks & Hants route passing Newbury at 1252 (2 early), during the previous day.

13/05 Having worked the Berkeley low level radioactive container trip during the previous day, 57004 + 20302 were paired on the 6V73 Crewe Coal sidings - Bridgwater flasks arriving at 0717 and return 6M63, with FNAs 550027 + 550048 departing at 1204, passing Temple Meads at 1306 and Filton Abbey Wood at 1313. The Windhoff MPV piling train, running with four

vehicles was noted in Temple Meads at 1956 on a Swindon - Swindon (via Taunton) working. 99709 131002, 131002 and 131005 were confirmed as part of the trains formation. Another evening observation was the arrival of MPV 98908 + 98958 on weed killing duty in the area as 6Z05 1525 Exeter New Yard (Waggoners Way) - Bristol TM (1908) via the former LSWR route being reported passing Chard SB at 1701 (3 late).

As reported previously now running under the Belmond British Pullman, steam loco 35028 Clan Line powered the 1Z82 0845 Victoria East -Bristol TM and 1284 1639 VSOE return to Victoria (2105) the inward being reported passing Bedwyn (on the Berks & Hants route) at 1142 (4 late) and North Somerset Junction 1334 (32 late), a delay being encountered in the Westbury area following a points failure at Hawkridge Junction. The ecs ran as 5Z83 1318 Bristol TM - Bristol East Freight Terminal for servicing, arriving here at 1456 (65 late) via a run round at Bristol West Junction, the loco was already facing the correct way for the return on arrival in the yard. The 1284 departed at 1657 (18 late), passing North Somerset Junction at 1705 (23 late), Keynsham at 1711 (26 late) and departing Bath at 1724 (23 late). The First/GW 1A26 1700 Bristol TM - Paddington HST service was reported as passing the steam service in the North Somerset Junction area. The Class 70 debut in Cornwall was delayed for a day as 70804 working a 6C96 1926 Westbury - Lostwithiel engineers (booked for a loco run round at Par from 2323 - 2353) turned up in Temple Meads off route, reason unknown, having departed 74 late. The Class 70 ran round the train and departed the station at 2356 for a return to Westbury! Steam locos; 5029 Nunney Castle and 34046 Braunton were both visible on Barton Hill depot during the day. Another steam loco passed through the area, 4936 Kinlet Hall working as a 5Z36 1140 Kidderminster (SVR) - Bishops Lydeard (1701) move with a support coach which passed Worcester SH 1216 (2 early), Lawrence Hill 1357 (3 early), for St. Phillips Marsh depot arriving at 1403 (15 early) and departing at 1505 (7 early) and passing Highbridge & Burnham at 1613 (-). Also of interest during the afternoon period, another working which attracted much attention, was DRS 37423 (displaying a new revised company livery) on a 6Z40 0939 Crewe - Plymouth Keyham Royal Dockyard flask working with submarine reactor wagons MODA 95771 and MODA 95770 being reported passing Kings Norton (Birmingham) at 1223 (2 late), Cheltenham 1339 (-), Yate 1431 (1 early), Lawrence Hill 1452 (6 early), Highbridge & Burnham 1545 (6 early), Taunton 1604 (6 early) and Exeter St. Davids 1650 (4 early). 37667 + 20302 powered the 6M63 Bridgwater - Crewe formed of a single FNA flask wagon, departing at 1105, passing Long Ashton at 1213 (having recessed in Yatton Loop) and Yate 1253. Further DRS activity saw 37423 return light from the previous days flask move as 0Z40 0930 Plymouth - Crewe Gresty Bridge which passed Bridgwater at 1207 (25 late), Long Ashton 1239, departing Temple Meads at 1303 (-), passing Yate at 1319 (8 early) and Cheltenham 1353 (22 early). Later, 57314 was an arrival with West Coast rail tour stock as 5Z35 1223 Southall WCR - Bristol Kingsland Road (1500) being reported passing Reading West Junction at 1307 (4 late). Using the West Coast stock brought in during the previous afternoon, steam 34046 Braunton powered the Railway Touring Company 'Welsh Borders' trip split into three workings as; 1Z36 0710 Bristol TM -Gloucester, 1237 0934 Gloucester - Worcester SH (via Kemble and Oxford) and 1Z38 1749 Worcester SH - Bristol TM (via Hereford, Cwmbran and the Severn Tunnel) and taking the ex. SR Bullied over unusual routes for the Class. Some timing reports for the day included; departing Parkway at 0744 (-), passing Yate at 0754 (-) and arriving Gloucester at 0822 (5 early), the loco then being turned light-engine on the triangle prior to the 1Z37

which passed Stroud at 0955 (4 late), the 1238 being later recorded passing Pilning at 2043 (7 early). This tour was originally planned to run on 03/05/14.

18/05 Having seen use on a 'Spring Scenic Settler' (1271 0635 Swindon -Carlisle) via Kemble and the Golden Valley during the previous day, 47805 + 47853 double-headed the return 5Z74 1418 Bristol TM - Crewe HS rail tour ecs via the Severn Tunnel and the Marches being reported passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1344 (42 early). Not only was the 'as required' (and currently not a regular runner via Bristol) Fridays Only Halewood -Southampton Eastern Dock loaded car train diverted via Bristol, but the northbound empties was routed this way as well with both booked to pass Yate at 1840, these workings being unusual through the area for a Sunday. Train details were; 66095 - 6Z38 0931 Halewood (Jaquar Cars) - Southampton Eastern dock (2144) reported passing Yate at 1840 (-) and Bath 1919 (1 late) and 66149 - 6Z44 1515 Southampton Eastern Dock - Halewood (Jaguar Cars) (2340) reported Bath at 1746 (8 late) and Yate 1921 (50 late). Some engineering train reports and loco allocations for the day were as follows; 66097 top n' tail 66065 - 6W01 0800 Trefforest - Westbury passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1633 (-), having earlier arrived Cardiff Central at 0822 (421 early!), 66132 top n' tail 66238 - 6W98 0800 Newport Gaer Junction - Westbury passing Filton Abbey Wood at 0901 (27 late), top n' tail 66514 - 6Y07 0910 Ashchurch - Taunton Fairwater yard HOBC passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1123 (3 late), 66545 - 6Y08 0900 Cheltenham -Westbury passing Filton Abbey Wood at 0928 (19 early), 66614 + 66602 -6Y27 0845 Moreton Cutting - Newton Abbot Hackney Yard (1221) passing Bath at 0956 (5 early) and Bridgwater 1048 (3 early), 66597 - 6Y67 1542 Newport Alexandra Dock junction - Westbury passing Patchway at 1724.

Swindon

Completion of redoubling the line to Kemble, has been put back to August mainly down to unexpected additional weather related problems and works teams having to travel to other areas for more 'essential' work for example the damaged sea wall at Dawlish. However, during May excavations and earthworks were noted underway east of Kemble Tunnel. A large amount of work is still to be undertaken with lengthy sections of double track in place, but with gaps more so towards the western end of the project, the current running line traverses a combination of old and new alignments, but this will eventually become the up line. Several footpath and occupation crossings have been rebuilt and single headed 'led' colour signals are now installed and in use in the Stroud area. The project certainly is more extensive than was thought in just replacing and relaying a second running line.

During mid May, Renewable Electricity and Gas Supplier SSE announced the closure of Uskmouth B power station after a buyer could not be found. The site is the oldest coal powered station in use, in the country having been built around 50 years ago. 80 people are employed at the facility. The power station provided its last electricity for the National Grid on 31/03/14.

Cardiff

- 29/04 The Royal train appeared westbound through Central station at 0643, having believed to have stabled overnight on the Machen branch line. The train reappeared at 0710 via platform 6, then onto the Valley line towards Queen Street station, the Royal party being scheduled to visit Ystrad Mynach during the day and later Llantwit Major on the Vale of Glamorgan line, although Royal Train use to the latter location was unconfirmed. The train was reported passing Caerphilly around 0720, thought to be the first Class 67s used over this route.
- **01/05** The relief lines were closed at 2150 from Cardiff Rhymney River bridge Cardiff East from this date until 11/05 at 1550 for track replacement work. Engineer's trains were to operate from Westbury, with stock piled ballast used from Cardiff Tidal.

PRESERVATION & INDUSTRIAL MATTERS

Mainline Preservation

14/05 Deltic 55002 The King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry hauled 50026 Indomitable as 0Z54 1644 Didcot GWS Centre - Kidderminster SVR (1941) passing Swindon East at 1712 (8 early) and Stroud 1801 (2 early). The Class 55 returned to Didcot light the following day as 0Z53 1039 Kidderminster - Didcot again via Stroud passing Swindon at 1243 (31 early), to rejoin the other preserved diesels moved from the recent Swanage diesel gala. It's hard to believe that 30 years have passed since 55022 (D9000) traversed this route on 28/11/81 with the 'Deltic Lickey Venturer' rail tour from York - Paddington one of several 'farewell' tours

around the country on the lead up to the Class 55 demise early in 1982. As the Magazine went to press, news form Cornwall suggests the turntable at St.Blazey Depot is now no longer serviceable due to lack of maintenance by the site operator DBS. This could seriously affect The Railway Touring Company's 'Royal Duchy' Bristol - Par steam rail tours detailed in the May Magazine which would need the facility to turn locos prior to their return journey away from Cornwall.

East Somerset Railway, Cranmore

Now resident on the line, DMU set 51909 + 56271 was booked to worked two round trips to Mendip Vale during the day, with Cranmore departures booked for 1145 and 1445.

Sharpness

18/05 The former docks internal rail system 4 wheel crane on a short section of track near the canal entrance lock (now disused) by the River Severn has been removed. The crane had been used to launch the lifeboat here and has been replaced by a ground mounted hydraulic crane which carries an installation date of January 2014 on its side.

Road Movements

Correction (May Magazine): The passing time on the M5 at junction 19 (Gordano) should have read 1755 not 1855 as stated for the Bagnall narrow gauge loco move.

Additional Information: The demo freight trains incomplete wagon number should read 780703. The former Fry's Sentinel loco under restoration in the old goods shed does have its boiler still on site, although a newly built one is under consideration as the overhaul of the old one could be counter-productive due to its condition.

MISCELLANEOUS

Bristol Area News

A new 15 year transport plan for the Bath area to reduce road traffic levels is looking at a possible rail and ride set up in the Bathampton junction area. A station did exist at this location but was closed with many others in the mid - 1960s. Other aspects are to be reviewed in the City including coach drop off locations and the monitoring of HGV movements.

At Weston-super-Mare, part of a Government station improvements fund of £100 million has been allocated and is to be used on entrance work including the installation of disabled lifts. The station is one of 42 throughout the country to receive finance, being one of only two in the South-West. Another development here will be the return of the ticket barrier to assist with revenue protection.

South Gloucestershire Station Celebrations

R.W.Giles 18/05 The friends of Yate Station Community Rail group celebrated the 25th reopening of the station with an open day from 1200 - 1500 held at the far end of the car park area. The station, the first of the former 1960s Beeching area casualties in the Bristol area to reopen was funded by Avon County Council at a cost of £130,000 and rebuilt by BR. During the event, the Westerleigh Brass band provided music and a local school, refreshments in a marquee with a number of local area railway

societies having sales or historical information stands on site alongside emergency services and BT transport police displays. Wickwar breweries were also providing an alternative popular refreshment service! A 'sit over' miniature railway with a steam loco was giving rides and an open top bus was also provided tours from the station into the local area. Guest of honour was Transport Minister Baroness Kramer who travelled down from London and being accompanied by the Pensions Minister, local MP Steve Webb, arrived on 153361 which along with 150202, formed the 2E38 1211 Bristol TM - Worcester Shrub Hill First/GW service which was greeted on arrival by the Mayor, councillors and officials on the up platform. It was interesting to note a returning pre wedding 'hen party' most in a worse for wear condition, assumed returning from a night in Bristol, also got off the same service and were confused with the amount of activity with suited staff and photographers on the platform! Speeches later took place in the pleasant afternoon sunshine in the car park area, with the Baroness stressing she was not visiting in an official capacity as this would not be allowed due to the closeness of the forthcoming European elections. She had accepted the invitation to this event in January this year.

Thanks went to the community group for their efforts, as well as the visiting stations users present and the regular rail man who issues tickets here during the morning period.

An impressive locally produced iced cake depicting the original 1844 platform with building and station sign 'change for Thornbury' was cut and distributed to those present. People had been seen picking at the handmade fondant 'ballast' long before the cutting ceremony was undertaken! The station was officially opened with staggered three coach platforms either side of Station Road on 11/05/89 with the unveiling of a plaque on the downside participants traveling on a special train working. 150247 worked the first public passenger train to call on 15/05/89 with the 0652 Gloucester - Penzance Regional Railways service (also see Magazine 209, July 1989). Both platforms were extended to accommodate four car trains due to increased passenger usage during 1992.
