NOTES & NEWS

Bristol Parkway, Stoke Gifford, Pilning, Yate and Westerleigh

The Colas 6V54 0535 Chirk Kronospan - Teignbridge empty log train was cancelled, the working ran to Baglan Bay instead, the loco however failing on the return working at Bridgend! However, having been revived, did make Tilbury with the inward 6L63 steel service from Margam, and later worked the 6V62 1100 Tilbury (Riverside) - Llanwern steel with 56113, which was reported passing Wootton Bassett at 1553 and Patchway at 1628. A 0Z51 0923 Crewe Heritage Centre - Eastleigh works (2147) via Lydney Junction loco move started out as 66732 + 31466 + 73001 + 73006, departing at 1202 (159 late). The working which was booked to pass Yate at 1834, Dr.Day's junction 1858 and Bath 1914 was however terminated at Lydney, and returned to Gloucester as no one was present on the Dean Forest Railway to except the first two locos! In the end, 66708 (which had run light 0Z66 from Ironbridge - Horton Road) and 73006 returned back to Derby with 66732 on completion of the move during the following day! The first of two Heineken Cup Rugby final specials for the Toulon 23/05 v Saracens match at the Millennium Stadium was top n' tailed with DRS locos 47853 + 47805 as 1Z34 1016 Euston - Cardiff Central (1353) being reported passing Swindon at 1209 (-) and Patchway 1241 (-). The return was 2050 Cardiff Central - Kensington Olympia during the following day, being recorded passing Parkway at 2156 (11 early), the ecs was believed to have been stabled at Briton Ferry. A freight report for the day was GBRf 66740 working 6A82 1247 Moreton-on-Lugg - West Drayton loaded stone passing Patchway at 1453 (-) and departing Parkway at 1509 (4 early) following a stop.

24/05 The second 'Ruggex' special to run was with DBS 67016 as 1250 0916 Euston - Cardiff Central (1225) and 2250 return to Paddington, being reported passing Didcot 1047 (1 early), and Parkway 1132 (9 early). Toulon came out the winners, with past World Cup hero Jonny Wilkinson playing a significant part in the game, which was his last before retirement. Other reports for the day included the 0012 1106 Margam LIP -Westbury light loco move, formed with 66040 only and note passing Patchway at 1250, Keynsham 1311 and Bath 1318 (41 early).

Return engineering trains from South Wales were of particular interest as the final three were with Class 70s possibly working their first round trips in traffic. Full train details for the day (with some recorded passing times) were as follows; 70805 - 7C21 1016 Newport Gaer junction - Westbury yard (a short train with loaded sleeper) passing Oldfield Park (Bath) at 1056, 70806 - 6C22 1110 Gaer junction - Westbury yard passing Oldfield Park at 1234, 70807 - 1247 Gaer junction - Westbury yard passing North Somerset junction (Bristol) at 1546, 70808 - 6C24 1530 Gaer junction - Westbury yard passing Patchway at 1634, 66848 - 6C25 1845 Gaer junction - Westbury yard, arriving Pilning loop at 1943 (and being passed by 66621 with the 6V82 Tunstead - Westbury cement service at 1954) and 70809 - 6C26 0108 (Mon) Newport - Westbury yard, having arrived as 6C43 0943 ex. Crewe Basford Hall. Some other Freightliner Heavy-haul engineering train reports included; 66597 + 66514 top n' tailing - 6Y07 0920 Stoke Works junction - Taunton Fairwater HOBC, 66619 - 6Y08 0915 Ashchurch - Westbury passing Lawrence Hill at 1026 and Oldfield Park 1048 and 66545 - 6Y27 0846 Charfield - Westbury yard, passing Lawrence Hill at 0827.

26/05 Having delivered 31466 + 73001 to the Dean Forrest Railway, from Gloucester the previous day, 66708 returned as 1154 Lydney junction -

- Cardiff Tidal sidings (via Gloucester) light being recorded as passing Yate at 1300 (15 early).
- 27/05 Colas 70805 'hired' to Freightliner Intermodal ran 0C30 0720 Stoke Gifford Bristol West Railport (0745) light passing Filton Abbey Wood at 0802 (39 late), prior to leading the 4L31 0901 loaded departure to Felixstowe in a top n' tail formation with 66540, being reported as passing Twerton, near Bath at 0946.
- **28/05** An engineering train report was; 66017 6250 0925 Newport ADJ Westbury (1158) formed of empty coal fish wagons passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1102 (1 late).
- 29/05 At 1500, Stoke Gifford 'downside' held; 66602 and 66619 only, with 66413 stabled on a west facing train of coal empties. An overnight MPV move was a 6Z05 2013 Kings Norton OTP depot Exeter Waggoners way (via Plymouth) was reported passing Yate at 2334 (70 late) and Bristol TM 2344 (70 late). The Plymouth visit was however cancelled due to late running.
- **30/05** A 1Z20 0555 Old Oak Common Derby RTC test train (1438) via a reverse at Swansea (0942 1008), was top n' tailed with 67025 + 67008 being reported passing Newport ADJ at 1146, Patchway 1213 and Parkway 1220 on the return. The dept c/stock formation was reported as; 72612 + 5981 + 72631 + 6263. Another report for the day later in the afternoon was GBRf 66718 working 6A82 Moreton-on-Lugg Hayes (Tarmac) loaded stone, which was also reported passing East Usk earlier at 1424.
- 31/05 66549 departed on an 8Z32 empty box wagon working to Cardiff Tidal sidings. Later, 66078 + 66132 + 66139 + 66007 formed the 0012 1106 Margam LIP Eastleigh light-engine move which was reported as arriving Westbury at 1418 where three locos then went forward to Eastleigh.
- 04/06 66514 + 66549 + 66597 passed Dr.Days Junction at 0820 (1 late) on 0Y50 0721 Westbury Stoke Gifford (0848) light-engine move.
- **07/06** 66047 + 66046 + 66002 + 66015 + 66122 + 66142 + 66003 + 66109 formed the 0X12 Margam LIP Westbury light-engine move, arriving at its destination at 1407. At 1900 Stoke Gifford 'downside' held; 66555, 66619, 66514 in the first row after the station, 66545 with coal empties in the middle and 66553, 66557, 66560, 66564, 66587, 66596 at the back.
- **08/06** Two evening freight reports at Patchway were; 66620 6V82 Tunstead Westbury loaded cement, departing at 2024 (following a crew change) and 66011 6A35 Moreton-on-Lugg Acton loaded stone departing at 2102.
- 09/06 Following extensive ground work and contaminated soil clearance, building work of the new Hitachi IEP depot in the Stoke Gifford 'triangle' near the Filton mainline junction chord, which started in late May, could be seen in the distance from the A38 road flyover (alongside the Royal Mail sorting offices) and from Patchway station. This will be the train inspection shed, the biggest building to occupy the 44 acre site, with a maintenance shed to be constructed alongside. The depot is expected to be complete during 2015. Former LM green one car sets 153325 + 153333 were noted paired working the 2C79 1400 Cardiff Central Taunton First/GW service.
- 10/06 Some evening freight reports through Patchway included; 66131 6C99 2147 (TO) Newport ADJ St.Blazey freight (passing at 2222), 66619 6L33 2124 Cardiff Tidal sidings Dagenham Down yard (2229), 66086 6E20 2202 Llanwern Exchange sidings (Spencers) Scunthorpe BSC with steel billets ex. Tremorfa Works, BDAs and BYAs (2240). Earlier in the day, a morning report for Yate was 60099 passing at 0652 on the 6V49 1934 (Mon) Tees New Yard Margam service passing at 0652 (3 late).
- 12/06 At 1700 the following were present in the 'downside'; 66524,

66557, 66594.

- 13/06 67027 top n' tailing 67029 worked a 1Z20 0555 Old Oak Common Derby RTC test train (via Swansea), in place of the NRMT HST set, being reported passing Parkway at 0735 and on the return departing Maindee West Junction at 1124 and passing Westerleigh Junction heading towards Yate at 1218. Later in the afternoon, 66125 worked the 6A97 Grange (Port Talbot) Acton molten slag (a train that had not run for some time), occupying Chipping Sodbury loop from 1637 1714 and GBRf 66714 on the 6A82 Moreton-on-Lugg West Drayton loaded stone.
- 14/06 The Saturdays Only, 0X12 Margam Westbury light loco 'convoy' was formed; 66047 + 66110 + 66008 + 66099 + 66039 + 66207 + 66051 passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1328 and arriving Westbury at 1425. 66051 had been added at Newport ADJ.
- 15/06 Engineering work between Hullavington and Westerleigh junction, during the afternoon found 70801, 70802, 70804, 70808 present, along with some Colas class 66/8 locos, some of the trains being in a top n' tail formation. The mainline was closed during the day with First/GW HST diversions operating via Filton, Day's Curve and Bath.
- 17/06 A DBS 6Z47 1331 Wembley Euro Freight Ops Centre Cardiff Docks Ryans (2038) train of 6 HKA stone empties (which in fact departed from Acton at 1429) behind 66124 passed Patchway at 1801 (18 early). The return was booked as 6Z48 2337 Cardiff Docks Crawley.

Later, 66848 + 66849 passed Parkway at 2039 (50 late) and Bath 2105 (46 late) as a 1751 Long Marston - Westbury light-engine move.

Locos recorded at Westerleigh on fuel tank duty have included; 60019/059/074/099. 66023.

Bristol Temple Meads, Barton Hill and Kingsland Road

- 10/05 Additional Information (June Magazine); The return 1Z53 1430 Plymouth Tyseley Steam Trust (2005) special worked by mainline preserved D1015 Western Champion was titled 'Western Lickeys the Banks'. Probably an understatement in the title with only four coaches!
- 17/05 First/GW have 'hired' in a Class 159 set to strengthen its Summer Saturday operation working 2E17 0723 Warminster Great Malvern, 1098 1046 Great Malvern Brighton and 1V96 1659 Brighton Bristol TM.159006 was the unit used during the day, with 159010 on 24/05 and 159003 on 31/05.
- 19/05 Rail tour stock off the two days previous 'Welsh Borders' outing (see last months Magazine) was returned as 5Z40 0955 Kingsland Road Southall Wcr (1528), via Salisbury, double-headed with 57314 + steam 34046 Braunton, being noted passing Keynsham at 1050, the c/stock formation being recorded as; 35451 (steam loco support), 99121, 99122, 99316, 99125, 99127, 3136, 99348, 1860, 4973, 99304.
- Later, 70804 latter passed through the area on a retimed 6Z47 from 1515 to 1015 Westbury Cardiff Canton departmental being reported passing Bath at 1159 (77 late) and East Usk 1256 (61 late). The loco later returned 0Z47 light to Westbury.
- **21/05** Arriva XC HST allocations for the day were reported as; 43384 XC02 43366-1V44 0600 Leeds Plymouth (1146) / 1S51 1225 Plymouth Glasgow Central (2228), 43304 XC05 43378-1V50 0606 Edinburgh Waverley Plymouth (1443) / 1E63 1525 Plymouth Leeds (2106).
- 22/05 The return 6C98 0445 Lostwithiel Westbury yard departmental, booked via Bristol with 70805 returned direct via Castle Cary. But later 70806 became the second Class member over the Bristol Taunton mainline with a 6C99 1922 Westbury Camborne departmental (0105) being reported

passing Bath at 1952 (1 early), Worle 2100 (4 early) and Bridgwater 2115 (7 early).

23/05 47832 + 47790 top n' tailed a return 1Z22 1654 Bath - Liverpool Lime Street Northern Belle dining special (the inward being reported as 0625 Chester - Bristol TM via Liverpool Lime Street and Crewe) formed with c/stock; Glamis (3174), Alnwick (3273), Car No 1566, Belvoir (3267), Warwick (3182), Harlech (3275), Chatsworth (3247), 325, Mow Cop (17167), Balmoral (10734), Crewe (10729). The ecs was stabled at Bedminster, then going forward as 1513 to Bath via a reverse at Swindon. Some inward train reports were; arriving Bath at 1218 (13 late) departing at 1223 (15 late) and arriving Temple Meads at 1239 (17 late) and the return, having departed Swindon platform 4 ecs at 1622 (1 late), then departing Bath at 1652 (2 early) and passing Keynsham at 1705 and Patchway for the Severn Tunnel at 1744 (16 late). On the freight side; 56113 + 56078 were unusually paired up for the 6V54 0535 Chirk Kronospan - Teigngrace (1308) empty log wagons, being reported passing Severn Tunnel Junction at 0831 (-), Filton Abbey Wood 0903 (2 late), departing Temple Meads at 0915 (3 early), passing Bridgwater at 0956 (1 early) and Taunton 1009. Both locos were to later retire to the Heathfield bay platform at Newton Abbot for the weekend.

24/05 Standing in for a failed 34067 Tangmere, Steam 60009 Union of South Africa worked the Railway Touring Company's 'West Somerset Explorer' 1Z34 0857 Kidderminster (not Bridgnorth as originally planned) - Bishops Lydeard (1308) and 1Z36 1830 return to Kidderminster (2225) with c/stock; 35486 (loco support), 99304, 4973, 4984, 1860, 99348, 3136, 99127, 99125, 99316, 99122. Passing time reports were; Yate 1144 (8 late), Lawrence Hill 1203 (12 late) and Yatton 1227 (12 late), with the return passing Bridgwater at 1911 (1 early) and arriving Temple Meads at 1945 (13 early), for West Coast 47237 to return the trip north. Former S&D 53808 (88) provided the steam hauling interest for the trip over the West Somerset Railway.

The First/GW Summer Saturdays HST 'relief' service 1072 0906 Bristol TM - Weymouth and 1V67 1644 return was in the hands of power cars 43128 + 43181. 43021 + 43041 had been originally allocated, but their intermediate coaches had 'low swing' couplings not permitted over third rail routes.

- 25/05 Steam 60009 Union of South Africa passed Bath at 1407 (5 late) via Box as 5Z37 1305 St. Phillips Marsh Southall (Wcr) with support coach, following rail tour duty. On 'hire' from SWTs, 159010 unusually worked the 2E34 0941 Bristol TM Cheltenham and 2T35 1203 return, First/GW services.
- 26/05 A Westbury Cardiff Canton light loco move was formed with 66848 + 66850, the pair being noted on Barton Hill depot at 1105, assumed for a fuel stop. 31465 was an evening arrival in Temple Meads on the up through line with a 3Z12 1754 Derby RTC Laira TRSMD test working at 2210. The booked departure time west bound was at 2218.

27/05 43003 made a 'solo' 0Z74 1328 Laira - St.Phillips Marsh depot move passing Bridgwater at 1532 and Uphill Junction 1546.

Also, earlier in the day the 6V74 0200 Crewe Coal sidings - Bridgwater passed Temple Meads at 0607 (11 late) with new livery 37423 top n' tailing 37608, later arriving Bridgwater at 0702 (17 late) before departing with the two FNAs at 1142 (140 early) and passing Bristol TM at 1224 (158 early).

Another freight report was the Colas loaded logs (from 23/05) with 56113 only (56078 being reported to have had battery problems and remaining at Newton Abbot) as 6M51 0956 Teigngrace - Chirk Kronospan (2358) being reported passing Yatton at 1500 (30 late) and Narroways Hill junction (Bristol) at 1525 (10 late).

- 28/05 Unusually, 56113 returned log wagon empties west as 6V54 0535 Chirk Kronospan Teigngrace (1309) having only delivered a loaded train to Chirk during the previous evening. Today's working was reported passing Severn Tunnel junction at 0834 (2 late), departing Temple Meads at 0914 (4 early) and passing Bridgwater at 0956 (1 early).
- 29/05 Despite another expected return with 56078 (as far as Exeter at least), the return 6M51 0956 Teigngrace Chirk Kronospan (2356) loaded logs ran with 56113 solo throughout, the train departing 94 late and passing Taunton at 1306 (22 early), Bridgwater 1339 (1 early), Parsons Street (Bristol) 1418 (26 early) and Pilning 1457 (37 early). A test train was present in Temple Meads formed; 31465 with dept c/stock; 6262, 62287, 9702.
- 30/05 A returned to mainline use, 50007 Hercules (formerly in a GW150 Brunswick green livery and named Sir Edward Elgar) was booked for a 0Z50 0953 Washwood Heath Exeter (Riverside) light engine move (due Bristol TM at 1300) to pair up with 56078 and then go forward as 0Z56 1532 to St.Blazey (1728) and collect stored 60096 for repair, however lack of a route conductor and a NR ban on Cornish mainline metals saw the move postponed. The Class 50 had been used on steel traffic in the Midlands during the previous couple of weeks. Earlier, a 6V53 0315 Exeter (Riverside) Newport ADJ (0728) freight formed of 16 china clay JIAs and a single TTA fuel tank was reported in Tiverton Loop at 0315, passing Yatton at 0552 (16 early) and Pilning 0655 (5 late).
- 31/05 The Summer Saturday Weymouth HST relief was worked with power cars 43172 + 43179 and coaching stock set OC56. Steam 5029 Nunney Castle returned 5Z54 1950 Cardiff Pengam Barton Hill (2105) passing Lawrence Hill at 2056 with support coach W35461. The loco had earlier in the day run 5Z49 0620 Barton Hill Cardiff Pengam, working the 1Z50 0604 Birmingham International onwards to Carmarthen (1158), then running round and being attached to the rear of the diesel hauled 1Z51 1332 to Fishguard Harbour (1430). Another report from this location was; 66602 + 66847 top n' tailing a 1932 Westbury Gaer Junction departmental at 2110 formed of JNA wagons.
- 01/06 Some engineering train allocation reports via Day's curve included; 66142 top n' tail 66078 6W07 (Sat) 2018 Westbury Treforest, (66142 1635 Sun Radyr Westbury return), 66078 top n' tail 66091 6W08 2330 (Sat) Westbury Radyr (66091 returning 1600 Sun to Westbury), 66031 6W09 1916 (Sun) Westbury Maindee, 0413 (Mon) Cwmbran Westbury.

 02/06 08822 arrived on the up through in Temple Meads in the early afternoon with HST power car 43156, which later ran 'solo' as a 0Z77 1650 move to Laira depot (1936) passing Uphill Junction at 1716 (7 late) and Taunton 1742 (9 late). It is unusual to see a Class 08 on the mainline
- these days as two drivers have to be provided for any such working. During the evening, the MPV Windhoff cabling train made an appearance in Bristol, working 6Y61 1613 Swindon Swindon passing Parsons Street at 1906 (5 early). It was interesting to note, the train had travelled via Kemble (1639 3 early), Gloucester, Chepstow 1743 (23 early), a reverse at Severn Tunnel junction, Bristol TM, a reverse at Taunton, Westbury and Chippenham, these being diversionary routes which may be used to access future electrification worksites. Over at St. Phillips Marsh during the afternoon, BR blue livery D3664 (09004) was present following reported wheel profiling during the previous afternoon. The loco was returning on a road move from the Avon Valley Railway to the Swindon & Cricklade Railway at Blunsden, after a 'loan' spell.
- **03/06** GBRf 66723 passed Bath at 0510 (13 early) with the 6A86 0203 Moreton-on-Lugg West Drayton (0837) loaded stone service. Later, 66413 +

66619 + 66549 passed the same location at 0813 (20 late) as a 0Y50 0813 Westbury - Stoke Gifford light loco move. Later, 37688 + 20304 were paired on the 6M63 Bridgwater - Crewe nuclear flasks being reported departing Temple Meads at 1224 (153 early) and passing Yate at 1333 (133 early). 57602 worked the First/GW 1A40 2145 Penzance - Paddington sleeper service (with c/stock set PZ89), passing Temple Meads at 0220 (15 early), Bath 0233 (15 early) and Chippenham (0244 15 early). The balancing 'down' working, the 1C99 2345 Paddington - Penzance (PZ88) was of interest, although not routed via Bristol, motive power being 'hired in' NR yellow 57305, in place of the booked Class 57/6. Following a naming ceremony at Exeter St.Davids (paired back to back with 43012 which ran 0Z12 1053 to Laira), 43017 Hannahs passed Bridgwater 'solo' at 1605 on a 0Z74 1430 Laira - St. Phillips Marsh move. First/GW Mark Hopwood was present at the ceremony, the power car taking the name of an all age disability charity group which has one of its main premises in Ivybridge, Devon. A preserved heritage light loco movement was D1015 Western Champion heading to the West Somerset Railway for the mixed traffic gala weekend, as 0Z52 0952 Washwood Heath (Metro Cammell) - Bishops Lydeard (WSR). The Class 52 was reported passing Yate at 1208 (45 early), arriving Temple Meads at 1235 (50 early) and departing at 1242 (49 early) and passing Bridgwater at 1323 (54 early). The expected accompanying Class 66/7 was not present due to driver availability.

06/06 37612 + 37608 departed Parkway loop for Bridgwater at 0509 with the 6V74 Crewe Coal sidings - Bridgwater nuclear flask, later being recorded on the return as 6M63 passing Temple Meads at 1221 (49 early). 07/06 Pathfinder Tour's 'Shrewsbury and Chester Explorer' (1Z23 0710 Eastleigh - Crewe and 1Z24 1629 return) with 67025, was recorded passing Keynsham at 0922 and Patchway at 0943 (3 late) following a Filton Abbey Wood stop, with c/stock; 3097, 3066, 1651, 3123, 3068, 21245, 1832, 4927, 35469, 3386. Newly named 43017 Hannah's + 43135 were on the First/GW 1072 and 1V67 Weymouth seaside 'relief'.

Another ex BR shunter was present for wheel turning at St.Phillips Marsh, being close to the wheel lathe during the day, this time it was 07010 from the Avon Valley Railway, following the visit of D3668 / 09004 over the previous weekend. The Class 07 was still reported as on site, awaiting collection three days later. Following a Swindon - Carlisle working during the previous day, 57313 and 57316 were present in Kingsland Road sidings with Statesman ecs formed; 6000, Car No 5912, Car No 5991, Car No 3360, Car No 3362, Car No 1211, 3312 Helvellyn, 3231, Ben Cruachan, Kitchen Car No 1659, 3188 Cader Idris, Car No 17080. The train departed as a 5Z68 1055 working to Southall (West Coast) being reported passing North Somerset Junction at 1104 and Swindon 1155. Another charter dining set to visit the area was the Northern Belle, top n' tailed again with the correct dedicated locos 47832 + 47790 as 1Z29 0739 Swansea - Telford Central being reported passing Pilning at 0915 (6 early), Lawrence Hill 0930 (6 early) and Dr.Days junction on the return at 0955 (-), the train then being routed via Parkway and Yate. The c/stock formation was reported as; Glamis, Alnwick, 1566, Belvoir, Warwick, Harlech, Chatsworth, 325, Mow Cop, Balmoral, Crewe and the return working, the 1735 departure from Telford was noted near Ashchurch at 1954 and departing Temple Meads following a reverse at 2111 (3 late). Trip participants, as well as there on board dining also had the choice of a visit to Ironbridge or RAF

Returning engineering trains from an occupation near Hullavington, and loco allocations (with a Lawrence Hill passing time for each) were as follows; 66849 - 6C32 1300 Westerleigh junction - Westbury yard (1314),

70808 - 6C33 1400 Westerleigh junction - Westbury yard (1435), 70805 - 6C35 1700 Westerleigh junction - Oxford Hinksey yard (1706), 70804 - 6C37 1805 Westerleigh junction - Oxford Hinksey yard (1956), 70810 - 6C36 1830 Westerleigh junction - Oxford Hinksey yard (1930).

A further working, 70809 - 6C38 was booked to operate as 0430 Westerleigh junction - Oxford Hinksey yard (0626) during the following day. Freight traffic, along with First/GW HSTs were being diverted through Filton, Dr.Days curve and Box during the day, 66011 with a 6B35 1237 Moreton-on-Lugg - Acton stone in PGA wagons being reported departing Patchway at 2102 following a crew change.

- **09/06** 37607 + 37610 top n' tailed a 1Z03 0524 Didcot Plymouth (1300) 'geometry test train' (formed with dept c/stock; 9523, 977974, 72639) being reported passing Trowbridge at 0728 (2 early), Bath 0752 (1 early), departing Weston-super-Mare at 0913 (-) and passing Bridgwater at 1015 (2 early) having visited the Highbridge loop en route. The train was due to make the following West Country location visits over the following days; Fowey and Newquay (10/06), Falmouth, St. Ives and Falmouth (11/06) and Bere Alston and Heathfield (12/06).
- 10/06 37608 + 37612 were paired on the 6M63 Bridgwater Crewe nuclear flasks, formed of 2 FNAs, which departed at 1204 and passed Worle at 1223 and Yate 1320. New first to second class coach conversions, 42520, 42564 and 42570 had all been reported in traffic by this date.
- Pathfinder Tours 'Purbeck Explorer' (1Z37 0547 Stafford Swanage and 1Z38 1550 return) was worked by 37423 (in new DRS livery) + 37402 with 37604 in a top n' tail formation and reported passing Yate 0839 (-), Lawrence Hill 0902 (2 early) and Bath 0917 (1 early). The return 1Z38 departed 2 late and passed Trowbridge at 1936, Bath 2006 (3 late) and Yate 2055 (4 late). Further DRS Class 37 activity during the day saw; 37607 + 37610 top n' tail a return 1Z03 0920 Plymouth - Barton Hill test train (via Looe), which later went forward as a 1Z04 1213 Barton Hill - Hither Green Down Reception (1628) working passing Lawrence Hill at 1216 (3 late), Westerleigh Junction 1229 (23 late) and Swindon 1301 (17 early) and later 37218 (the second class member in the new Class 68 style DRS livery) + 20304 paired on the 6M63 Bridgwater - Crewe single FNA nuclear flask, which departed at 1205 and passed Lawrence Hill at 1308 and Yate 1320. Other report for the day included Exeter out based 143617 standing on the up through line in Temple Meads at 0900 carrying St. Ives in its destination blind, but heading for St. Phillips Marsh depot, and 66850 passing Lawrence Hill at 1221 on a 1018 Taunton Fairwater - Cardiff Canton light loco move, having worked a 6Z27 1403 West Ealing - Taunton departmental during the previous day.
- 14/06 The First/GW 1072 0905 Bristol TM Weymouth and 1V67 1644 return HST 'relief' was formed with power cars 43071 + 43130 (with intermediate HST stock LA16). This service is now called the 'Weymouth Wizard' reviving a name once used on a Swindon Weymouth loco-hauled midweek summer extra which ran on Tuesdays and Thursdays during July and August from 1981 1985. A painted headboard was often carried by the loco working these trains. Although a headboard is not carried in 2014, a catering service is provided along with the unusual sight of a HST set over this normally Sprinter DMU worked route.

Vintage Trains 'Whistling Ghost 2' (1Z34 0805 Tyseley (Warwick Road) - Bishops Lydeard (1245) was worked throughout by steam 5043 Earl of Mount Edgecumbe being reported as departing Birmingham Moor Street at 0822 (-), passing Cheltenham at 1005 (-), Charfield 1031 (-), Filton Abbey Wood 1047 (5 early), Uphill Junction 1155 (9 late), following a signal check and Bridgwater 1206 (8 late). Ex. Somerset & Dorset 53808 (88) took over from

the Castle on the West Somerset Railway and for the 1Z35 1710 return, which 5043 again took charge of at Bishops Lydeard departing at 1830 (-) and then passing Bridgwater at 1908 (4 early), departing Temple Meads at 2003 (-), passing Yate at 2030 (5 late) and arriving Tyseley Steam Trust at 2329 (4 late).

- **15/06** The 1C36 2330 (Sat) Paddington Cardiff Central First/GW HST service (formed 43122 OC56 43004) was diverted and terminated at Temple Meads following a lightning strike affecting signalling in the Thames Valley area. The train had been reported as passing Wootton Bassett Junction at 0229 (94 late).
- 16/06 The mainline preserved Class 52 No. D1015 Western Champion returned from its spell of operation on the WSR including gala weekend use. The loco departed 0Z52 solo for Washwood Heath (1422) without the Class 42 Warship Greyhound as expected, leaving Bishops' Lydeard (GBRf) at 0953 (9 late) and passing Filton Abbey Wood at 1112 (-) and Yate 1126 (6 late).
- 17/06 31233 led the 3Q01 1754 (Mon) Derby RTC Exeter (Riverside) test train through the area being reported passing through the town station at Weston-super-Mare, on the loop at 0106 and not long after, Uphill Junction at 0109 (6 early).

Another early hours report was NR yellow 57305 (still on hire to First/GW) working the 1A40 2145 Penzance - Paddington (0519) sleeper service (with c/stock set PZ88 - 17173, 12100, 10219, 10590, 10594, 10589, 10616) being recorded passing Yatton at 0209 (11 early), Bristol TM 0222 (13 early), Parkway 0238 (12 early) and departing Swindon at 0318 (-). The balancing 1C99 from Paddington - Penzance with 57605 was confirmed as routed via Westbury. Both sleeper trains were reported as diverted by Honiton, Yeovil, Castle Cary and Westbury during the previous overnight period.

A new stone flow from the Mendips could be commencing during 2015 with material for use in the construction of the new Hinkley Point C power station, being moved to this location by sea.

to an unspecified delay in the Wolverhampton area passing Walsall at 1404 (140 late), however time was regained, Charfield being passed at 1609 (34 late) and Parkway at 1625 (21 late). The working was noted on the Portbury branch near Ashton Gate at 1651 around 20 late.

Test bore hole drilling at 24 locations along the disused Portishead section of the branch from Portbury Dock junction was scheduled to take place during April and May so underlying ground condition and soil contamination could be monitored, ready in the long term for the reopening of this section for passenger trains now expected during 2019.

28/05 The evening 6M95 2146 Ironbridge loaded biomass was cancelled, assumed due to loading issues.

29/05 The 6M95 had a rare daytime departure time slot at 1220, however the eventual leaving time with 66726 was recorded at 1325, being later reported passing Bedminster at 1400 (60 late). The booked route via Gloucester was not taken and the train ran via Severn Tunnel junction 1440 (55 early), this again being unusual due to the train loco having to perform an additional run round at Bescot, and retrace its route, to gain the Ironbridge branch crossover and trailing point over the up line.

The new track section was planned to be joined to the main single line on 8th

June, and the existing single line lifted. The new alignment was to be

brought into use on Monday 9th June, the work allowing a second platform to be added at Pye Corner in the future.

The trains involved were as follows and which arrived throughout the day on Saturday, with the discharged/loaded trains moving further up the branch as far as Risca station, at the end of the work six of the trains were nose to tail between Rogerstone and Risca stations with the seventh at the Pye Corner site.

Bristol Area News

28/05 Engineering firm Sisk commenced construction of a new £11 million access bridge off Cattle Market road into the former Bath Road diesel depot site (demolished in 2003). The structure, which is to be tree lined on its sides has already been nick named Bristol's 'Wembley Way'! A revised concert hall plan has now been approved and work on the project is expected to be completed by 2016.

Taunton

A £4.6 million grant is expected to be used to improve station facilities here, including the entrance area and subway as well as increased parking space for cars and road bus connections as well as increased taxi ranks. Transport Minister Patrick McLouglin visited the station on 12/06 to inspect the current situation.

Electrification Is Coming - 3!

Bridge work is underway in a number of areas and has caused problems for road users in some of the small villages that they serve, as often rebuilding work and long closure periods are underway. For example at Dauntsey Lock, Wiltshire (between Chippenham and Hullavington), a 22 week works programme is progressing with a 20 mile road diversion in place connecting both parts of the village. Around 200 bridges will have to be 'modernized' during the works period. An interesting development at Royal Wootton Bassett will see the A420 main road from Swindon - Bristol via Chippenham closed for a substantial period of time as it crosses both the South Wales and Bristol routes within a short distance over two separate brick arched bridges.

Sleeper Change in Scotland

Transport Scotland has selected the Serco Group, the international service company to run the Caledonian Sleeper service for the next 15 years, from April 2015. The new operator will be responsible for the marketing, sales, stock maintenance, passenger service and station facilities related to the workings and will operate outside the Scot Rail franchise. Over £100 million will be spend on new rolling stock to improve the service which runs between London and Fort William also calling at a number of other Scottish cities and towns en route. New coaching stock is expected to be fully introduced by the summer of 2018, the total revenue for Serco in the 15 year period is estimated at up to £800 million, of which £180 million will form a franchise payment.
